

### FORENSIC INTEREST AT W. U. INCREASING

#### Four Leaders in Debate and Oratory Graduated; Must Fill Places

Considerable interest in the program of forensic activity for the coming school year was shown at a gathering of interested students at the home of Dr. John O. Hall following the forensic festival last week.

By graduation the university loses four who have been outstanding in forensic work. These are Irene Breithaupt, Bernice Mulvey, Charles Redding and Robert Witty. Their places will be difficult to fill.

In the new crop of men for debate Fred Toose, Roy Harland and Thomas Potwin appear to be the most promising material. Potwin has a younger brother that will enter the university this fall, who has had experience in high school debate under a good coach, and a year of university training should make good varsity material out of him. Lars Nelson, Allen Northrup and Lowell Mundorff also did work on the debate squad the past year.

In women's debate Margaret Pro and Evangeline Hall will be the leaders for the coming year. Edith Starrett, who has a good record in high school debate to her credit. Esther Lisle and Pearl Craig will hold over from last year's squad.

The questions for debate chosen by the Pacific Coast Forensic League for the coming year are of wide public interest, and it is expected that Salem people will give better attendance to debates the coming season than in some seasons past. The questions for debate will be selected from among the four following:

"Resolved: That the Russian plan of disarmament proposed at the Geneva conference be adopted by all nations."

"Resolved: That a plea of temporary insanity in defense of crime be prohibited by law."

"Resolved: That installment buying of consumption goods be prohibited by law."

"Resolved: That the policy in the United States of offering higher education to all the people should be abandoned."

Dr. Hall has stated that most of Willamette's debating will be on the first two of these questions. Dr. Hall is taking special interest in the second subject, as he has made extensive study in the fields of sociology, psychology and criminology.

During the past two years Willamette has had good teams, and the yhave made excellent records in competition with schools of their own class and larger. Dr. Hall will have considerable work this year in training a much-changed squad, but the interest manifest in the work will be of considerable help.

### ASK PRESERVATION OF FISH IN OREGON

#### Initiative Petitions Prepared and Sent to Attorney General Today

Four initiative measures which would protect the Rogue, Umpqua, Deschutes and McKenzie rivers from commercial use, were filed in the state department here Tuesday by Edward Plasecki, president of the Oregon Game Protective association.

The measures have been referred to the attorney general and will go before the voters at the next general election.

PORTLAND, June 12—(AP)—Four initiative petitions to preserve for food and game fish propagation and recreation the waters of the Rogue, Umpqua, Deschutes and McKenzie rivers were sent to the attorney general of Oregon for title today by the Oregon game protective association. A vote on the plan was held here Monday.

Tributaries of the rivers mentioned, with the exception of the White river, a branch of the Deschutes, are included in the petitions which seek the prevention of any further encroachment for purely commercial enterprises.

It is set forth in the petitions that a maintenance of the various rivers in their present form is highly desirable and that the waters shall not be diverted or interrupted in their natural flow for
