## DEATH OF BIG TIM LAID TO GANGSTERS

Chicago Racketeer Died Victim of Own Profession, Police Assert

CHICAGO, June 28.—(AP)—Big Tim Murphy, pioneer Chicago racketeer, assassinated Tuesday in his front yard, died a victim of his profession, the police decided last night.

The shots which ended the chromatic career of Big Tim, according to police theories, were fired by the agents of some racket into which the former newsboy, labor leader, estate legislator, convict and racketeer was trying to force himself.

Murphy met death as suddenly and dramatically as have a score of Chicago gangsters. Summoned by the ringing of his door bell, Big Tim walked into the yard of his home in exclusive Rogers Park and four men in an automobile, fired 30 shots at him and fled. Only two took effect but he died almost instantly.

There were plenty of motives for Murphy's enemies to kill him, police said. He was twice accused of murder, was convicted of participation in the Dearborn street station mail robbery in 1920 and served a term in Leavenworth penitentiary, was for years head of various Chicago labor organizations and had been interested in racketeering, the term applied to those who prey on labor or small businesses under the guise of affording benefits by organization.

The main problem of the police was to find the particular activity that led to his death. Recently Murphy's name had been mentioned in connection with the organization of rival cleaners and dyers' organizations and also in connection with the organization of independent vice resorts as distinguished from the organized vice syndicates reported in operation.

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## Associated Press Eyes And Ears of News Public

HOUSTON, June 28.—(AP)—Convention radio listeners throughout the country were given a brief account today of the activities of the Associated Press convention staff by Kent Cooper, the general manager, who spoke over the extensive hookup just before the afternoon session began.

Mr. Cooper pictured the staff of 65 writers as neutrals and as "your eyes and ears" at the quadrennial political gatherings. "You may wonder," he said, "just why men and women came thousands of miles to one of the extreme southern cities to give vent to such enthusiasm as you have heard swell into cheers and fall into pandemonium in approbation of various names that have been mentioned."

"An element is the love of combat. This convention, as was the one in Kansas City, is in effect a stage of battle—the great quadrennial political battle. Man's love of a contest is in evidence here."

"But both at Kansas City and here there are some neutrals. 'We, of the Associated Press, have nothing to do with the outcome. We have no candidates to boost, nor issues to defend or attack. But we are earnestly engaged in the business of writing this colorful, vital story of a great moment in our political life as a nation, so that all the people may know and understand what has been done here and what it all means. It is our business, as reporters, to see that you shall have it all in readable form for your immediate information and your timely reflections."

"We believe, as you believe, that if the people know all the facts they will never fall of a false decision. They need facts of the amazing colorful picture down here in the far south in this huge but beautiful hall that shall be clear, understandable, truthful and nothing more. Yours is the deciding voice on any national issue; ours but the relentless un-sleeping business of giving you the facts on which to form your opinion."

"We are neither democrat or republican, wet nor dry, Protestant nor Catholic; but only your eyes and ears. On behalf of 65 staff writers of the Associated Press, I salute you."
