TB STUDENTS VISIT
MAKE TOUR OF COUNTY HEALTH DEMONSTRATION
The class of tuberculosis workers who have been attending the two weeks' tuberculosis institute held at the Portland division of the University of Oregon summer sessions were Salem visitors yesterday. Thirty-eight students, representing six of the states west of the Mississippi, made the trip as a part of the class program.
The group visited the Marion county child health demonstration to become familiar with the work here, and were told of the demonstration's objectives by Dr. William DeKleine, director.
Following the visit to the county unit, the tuberculosis workers made a tour through the state tuberculosis institution.
The Portland class is sponsored by the national and Oregon state tuberculosis associations.

He saw personally both James W. Good of Chicago and Senator Moses of New Hampshire, who are mentioned respectively for the western and eastern headquarters management, but there were still no announcements as to their appointment. Henry J. Allen, of Kansas, the new national committee publicity director, also spent an hour with Mr. Hoover at the commerce department and then took up his work at the national committee meeting.

Kinsey, of Vermont, was induced to accept duty as assistant to Chairman Work today and will be stationed in the Washington offices. Several of the eastern committee men invited to this meeting tomorrow notified the chairman of inability to attend, but were enough on hand or represented by proxy to hold the session. The time was fixed as 3 p. m. Saturday.
