

Athletics Tied With Yankees

TWO NINES NOW NECK AND NECK

Senators Wallop New York in Doubleheader; Mackmen Win Twice

NEW YORK, Sept. 7.—(AP)—Almost on the eve of one of baseball's gaudiest "crucial" series, the Athletics of Connie Mack caught up with the Yankees today. It's been a stern chase and a long one since that day in July when the Yanks boasted a 13½ game lead over the field.

It took the ringing bats of the Washington Senators, and not Athletics, however, to rout the Yanks in two games today and end a stalemate that has been on, but with slowly diminishing force, since last April. While Philadelphia trimmed the Boston Red Sox twice, the Senators whipped the Yanks 11 to 0 and 6 to 1, and showed Connie's crew into an absolute tie for first place. Both the Yanks and Athletics have won 37 victories against 47 defeats.

FRENCH TENNIS STARS WINNERS

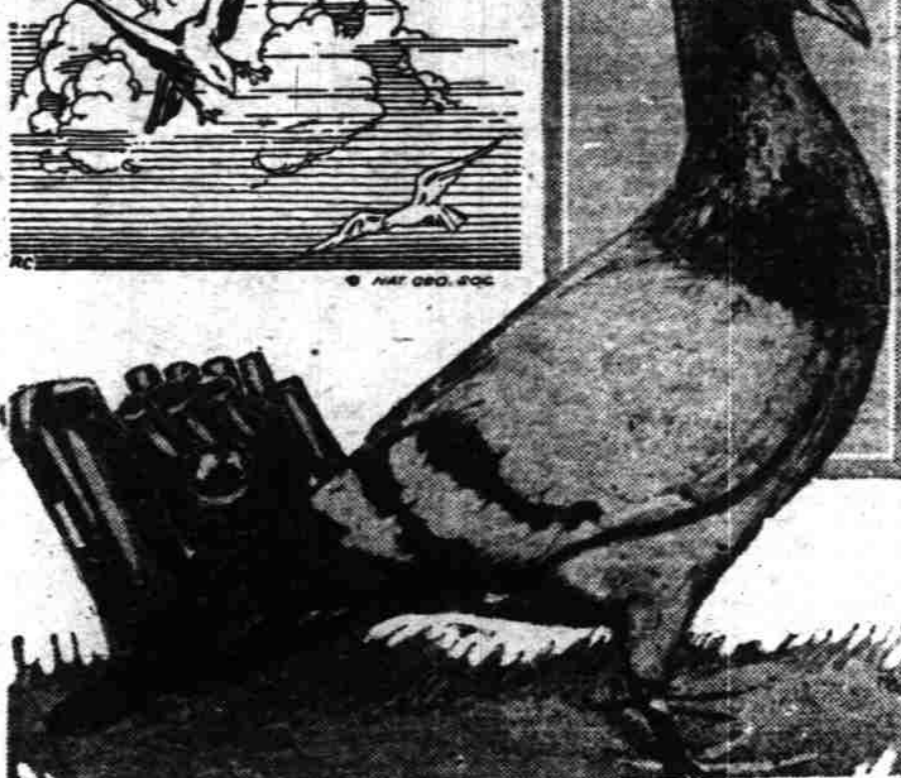
PHILADELPHIA, Pa., Sept. 7.—(AP)—Carrying on where they left off here last summer when they won the Davis cup, French tennis players swept to victory in three matches out of four today to take a commanding lead in the Franco-American team contest which will be concluded with five matches tomorrow. The invaders need only two more wins to clinch the series.

Sadly missing the services of Big Bill Tilden, the disqualified star who learned to play on these same courts, the United States was able to win only one match. John Van Ryn, Orange, N. J., downed Jacques Brugnon by scores of 5-3, 6-5, but George Lott, of Chicago was beaten by Henri Cochet, 6-1, 6-3. And John Hennessey, of Indianapolis bowed to Jean Borotra 6-3, 6-4, in the other singles.

With a chance to square matters in the doubles match with the French youngsters Christian Bousne and Pierre Landry, the youthful John Doeg, of Santa Monica, California, and Wilbur F. Coen, Jr., of Kansas City, were added to the list of U. S. casualties by scores of 6-2, 7-5.

In an exhibition match Miss Helen Mills, woman champion of three nations, met Wilmer Allison of Texas, former inter-collegiate champion and present No. 11 in the national ranking. With Allison hitting out as severely as though playing a man, Queen Helen of Berkeley was beaten by scores of 6-1, 6-1.

M'UGH MOVES UP IN TOURNEY

Defender of California Golf Title Makes Strong Showing at Meet

DEL MONTE, Cal., Sept. 7.—(AP)—Faded hopes of four players were scattered over the green-turfed fairways of Pebble Beach today. While four other golfers all in quiet of the 1928 California amateur championship, peered anxiously into the haze of another day.

The heart-breaking third round today saw Johnny McHugh, defending champion, continue his steady advance to another crown. His step into the semi-finals was followed by Russell and Harold Thompson, brothers, of Glendale, and that golfer extraordinary, H. Chandler Egan.

McHugh, slim San Francisco youth, played an unwavering but not unusual game to eliminate Chuck Hunter, Tacoma, 2-1. It was a closely contested battle with Hunter's sporadic wildness rising up like a juggernaut to crush him at the crucial moment. After winning the 14th, to make him only one down, Hunter missed a two-foot putt on the 16th for a half. McHugh dropped his ball in the hole for a par four. Hunter took five. They halved the next two holes and McHugh moved into the semi-finals.

McHugh toured the first nine in 39 and at the end of the ninth hole, which he won, was three up on the tall Tacoman. Hunter conceded the eighth after reaching an impossible lie in a trap.

Last year this same pair fought it out in the finals and their match today attracted the largest gallery so far this week.
