WASHINGTON, Sept. 12.-(AP) .- Having uppermost in his mind the necessity of "doing something" about the \$94,000,000 deficit expected next June 30, President Coolidge discussed reduction of federal expenditures with his cabinet officers immediately upon returning to Washington today from a three-months' vacation in Wisconsin.
