

WEDDING APPLICANT HELD AS MURDERER

SPOKANE, Sept. 26.—(AP)—Archie Much was formally charged here with having decoyed Mrs. Katherine Clark of Boston, Mass., to Spokane under promise of marriage, and with slaying her with a hatchet to get her money.

The murder charges were filed after Sheriff Floyd Brower of Spokane county dug up in the back yard of Much a roll of bills believed to have been brought here by the woman, and a bundle of love letters which police say Much wrote to her.

ST. CLAIRSVILLE, O., Sept. 26.—(AP)—John Eberhardt, 40, a coal miner, is under arrest here on the charge of leading a band of "nightriders," who are said to have attempted to lynch Mrs. Goldie Wheeler, 21, and Lester Berry, residents of Barton, a mining village near here.

Miss Hannah Gallagher, 18, Berry's sweetheart, who also is alleged to have been chosen as a victim of the "nightriders," escaped while the trio was being dragged from a buggy in which Berry was taking his sweetheart for a ride.
