He pointed out the potential danger of such a situation and then. taking up the salient defects of the proposed charter showed that its adoption would have led to "a lot of autocratic and mischievous actions to the harm, injustice and great expense" of the public.

William Gahlsdorf, a member of the city council, also congratulated the Lions upon having opposed the proposed charter.
