

RANGE CATTLE REPORTED FAT

Livestock Survey of State Details Made Public by Dr. Lytle

Oregon range animals are entering the fall pastures with more fallow on their ribs than in most previous years, according to a survey completed recently under the direction of Dr. W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian.

"This would insure a fair calf crop and a good winter and spring lambing," said Dr. Lytle in his report. "The range is fat, while dry, has been plentiful. The range cattle grower is now well on his way to prosperity. The large cattleman has survived but the small cattle raiser has been hard hit. Those still in the game had short calf crops because of a shortage of range bulls.

"Excepting the past year since the deflation period began, there has been a notable decrease in the purchase of bulls. This was to be expected because of the low ebb of the industry. One of the Oregon range cattle growers' greatest obligations is that of obtaining a large calf crop. Calf crops are dependent upon the use of a sufficient number of bulls. The bull power, as some owners call it, is now at low ebb. Frequent protests have been filed because such and such a breeder has not turned out a sufficient number of bulls to comply with the laws of the state providing that that one purebred bull shall be turned out with each 25 head of female stock or fraction thereof.

Weakness in Law

"There is a weakness in our existing law, in that no discrimination is made as to the age of the animal that is to be turned out on the public domain. Old bulls are worthless from the standpoint of breeding and we are in the position of having a very large percentage of old bulls.

"The range calf crop of the state runs somewhere around 60 per cent of the mature females. This is not enough. Some of the better conducted outfits have run as high as an 85 per cent calf crop in range mated animals. This high percentage calf crop has been attained through the use of a one to 20 ratio of young bulls.

If Oregon could increase its calf crop from the present 60 per cent to 80 per cent it would in a large measure compensate for the present badly shrunken herds.

"Oregon's horse health has been excellent, the state is famous for its freedom from infectious diseases of horses. Officials at the Canadian border ports ago that reported several years ago that the Oregon horse tested at the international boundary line were the most free from glanders and other diseases of any horses examined.

"There seems to be little hope of a market developing for the majority of the range horses that weigh less than 1200 pounds. There was a ray of hope for a better market for these animals during the past summer for the reason that certain representatives of the Russian Soviet government visited the northwest and made a survey as to the available horse-flesh that might be had from Oregon at a relatively cheap price. Some animals were purchased by these investigators."

SALEM HIGH'S NEW FIELD NEARS SHAPE

(Continued from page 1) field will include all of the area back to the tennis courts just inside the fence on the west. A batted ball will have to travel 450 feet to reach the tennis courts, and it is believed that Babe Ruth himself couldn't put any homers over the fence in this park.

Movable bleachers will be placed north of the grandstand for the football season, and may be moved closer to the first and third baselines for baseball.

Showers Provided

The space under the grandstand will be equipped with dressing rooms and shower baths for the teams.

For big contests in which large crowds are expected, this field is ideally situated with respect to parking space. The school district owns the space north of B street to C street between the fence and 14th street, and all this space will be available for parking automobiles, as well as the several streets in the vicinity.

The main entrance is at B street, back of the grandstand, where a ticket office will be built; but there are three automobile gates and four pedestrian gates into the field. However, the fence extends all the way around the field and there is no opportunity for "deadheads" to wander in without paying admission.

Room for Circuses

Circuses will still be accommodated on the space north of the gridiron, which ordinarily will be a practice baseball diamond for the high school. On the opposite side at the north, the junior high football and baseball field has been laid out.

South of the gridiron in conjunction with the playground apparatus, space has been provided for two playground baseball diamonds, and a volley ball court. Two paved tennis courts will be built near the southwest corner. None of the trees in the south end of the enclosure will be removed, so that the natural beauty of the location will be preserved.

All of the improvements authorized for the present year will be completed this week, but the school board plans to make additional improvements as athletic activity in Salem increases. The high school student body expects to pay for the grandstand, which cost \$8500, in three years. The field is 800 feet long, from a street to C street, with some additional space back to the mill stream west of 13th street, and is 500 feet wide.

Peacetime Fight By U. S. Forces To Be Held Monday

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Oct. 20.—(AP)—On an imaginary battle line stretching fifty miles across the hill country north and west of San Antonio, troops of the second army division will clash at a zero hour some time before dawn Monday in the most imposing field maneuvers peacetime military forces have undertaken. A hypothetical army of more than 200,000 will participate. MANY TO MAKE HAWAIIAN TRIP

Fine Program Arranged for Passengers on Malolo From Northwest

HONOLULU, T. H., Oct. 20.—(Special)—Members of the Pacific Northwest's special cruise to Hawaii this fall will be presented at the royal courts of seven dynasties of Hawaiian rulers.

The court scenes will be produced in Honolulu by the Daughters and Sons of Hawaiian Warriors society, re-enacting a century of island history. The production, Kaa Ona Malama (The Season of Attraction), is scheduled for November 15, the day after the arrival of the excursionists from the northwest section of continental United States.

The pageant is to be an annual affair, presenting native folklore, music and dances in their evolution through the reigns of the monarchs from the time of Kamehameha I to Queen Liliuokalani's court.
