

MUSEUM BEING PUT IN ORDER

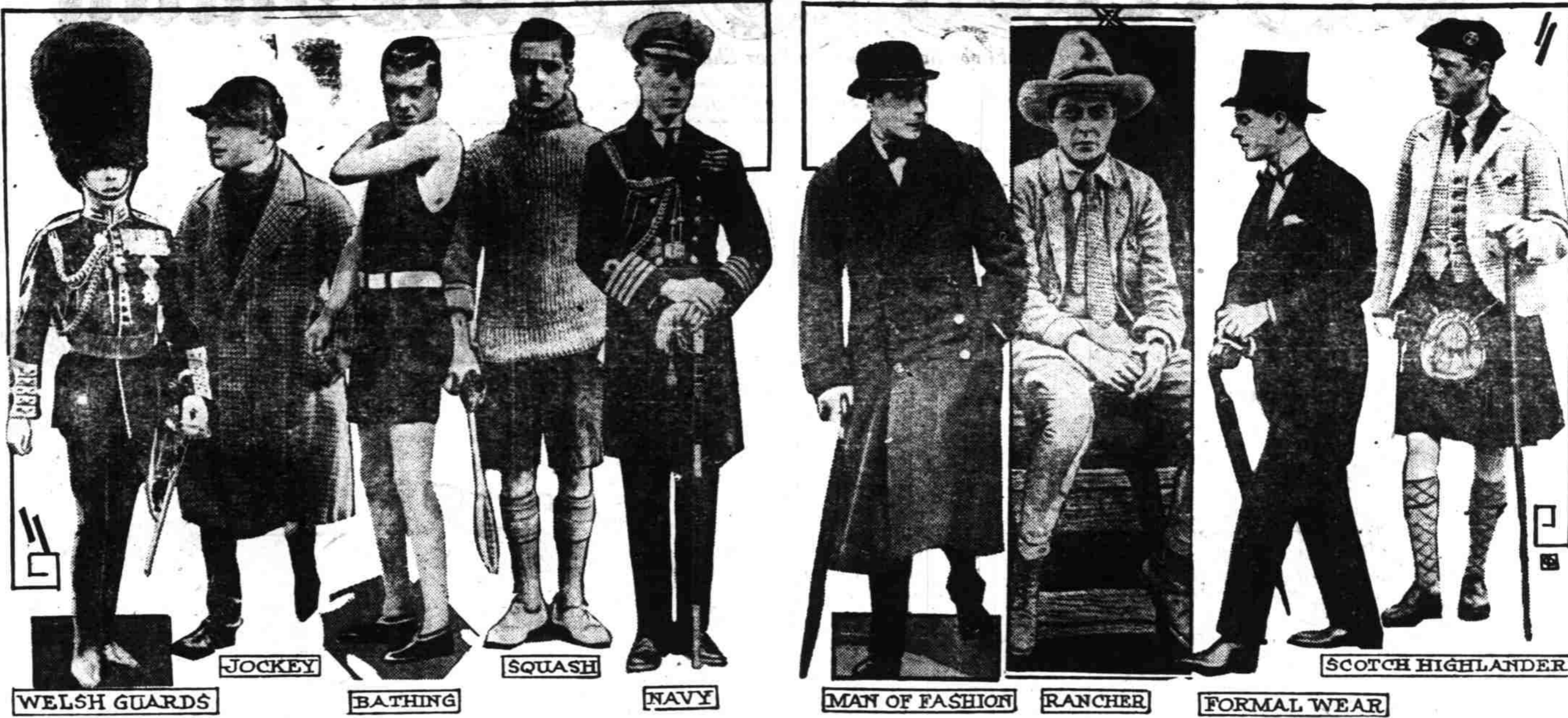
Valuable Collection at Willamette Classified and Arranged

For several weeks Prof. Herman Clark of Willamette university has been at work arranging, classifying and cataloging the specimens in the Willamette museum. The specimens were moved to a large room on the second floor of the gymnasium building more than a year ago, and the work of making an orderly arrangement of them has been prodigious.

Two large cases contain birds and reptiles of Central America. These specimens were made by Professor Morton E. Peck of the biology department on an expedition several years ago. All these specimens are in good condition and were classified and cataloged by Professor Peck himself. The museum is in possession of a variety of material relating to the pioneer days in Oregon. Guns, Indian instruments of war, saddlebags, the large Bible presented to the Oregon Institute, and the first printed diploma issued by Willamette university are some of the articles in this collection.

Classifies Minerals
"We have a lot of good stuff here," said Professor Clark in showing it, "but it can't be of a great deal of use until it can be shown in an orderly way." In addition to being cramped for time to work on the collection, Professor Clark is hampered by lack of adequate showcases in which to arrange and exhibit the specimens.

England's Crown Prince in Characteristic Poses

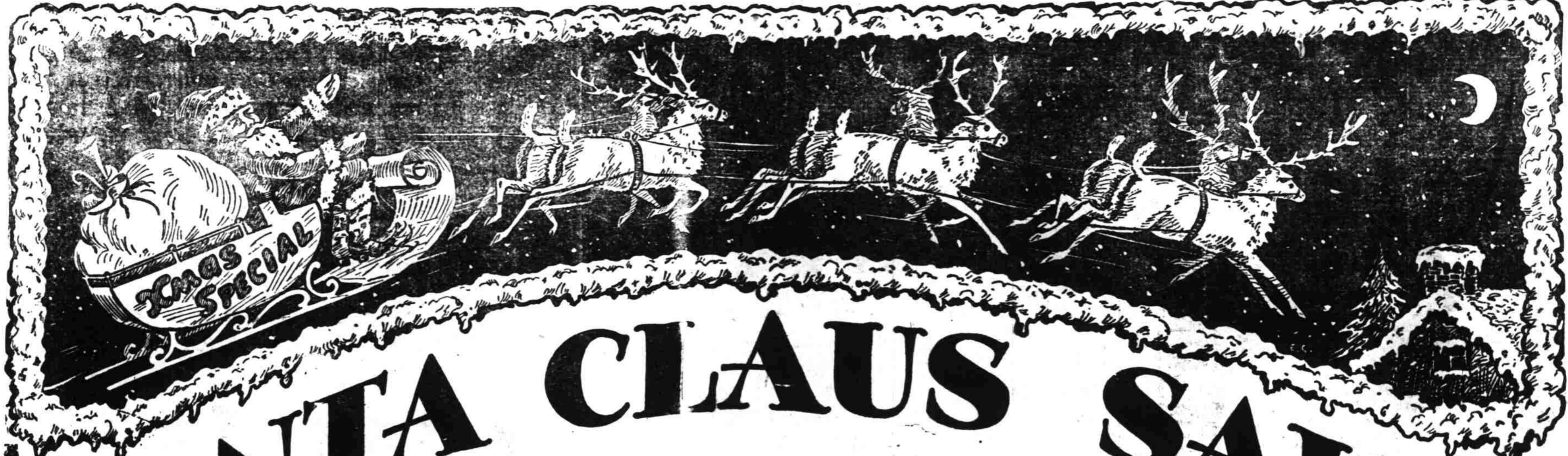


RURAL HEALTH IS OF URBAN CONCERN

Because modern rural and urban health conditions react upon each other, rural health work concerns the welfare of city people to as great an extent as that of the country people, points out a recent bulletin of the federal public health service released Tuesday from the office of the Marion county child health demonstration.

The bulletin says further that control of interstate traffic by inspection and quarantine at city and state borders is futile, and that from a sanitary standpoint, state and federal agencies should encourage and help the development and permanent maintenance of local health departments, which may best accomplish the health work.
