Hannula was convicted of mur. dering his wife following a birthday party held in his honor. The crime was alleged to have occurred on February 23, 1928. He was ntenced to a life term in the state penitentiary.

The supreme court also heard Friday the case of John E. Smith, who was convicted under the habflual criminal act in Multnomah county, and sentenced to a life term in the penitentiary. It was alleged that Smith had been convicted on six felony charges. Attorneys for Smith attacked the constitutionality of the habitual eriminal law.

Another-case argued in the supreme court Friday was that of Joseph Smith, accused of practicing medicine without a license. This case was appealed from Multnomah county


