### MARKETS AGAIN ABOUT NORMAL

Holiday Activity Nearly Over  
Vegetable Price Changes  
Are Noted

With the holiday season virtually past, Salem market conditions have resumed a normal trend, which for the most part will be held until present supplies begin to be exhausted and new commodities arrive in some quantity.

In the line of vegetables there were several price changes this week. The arrival of California cauliflower brought a wholesale reduction of 50 cents on the local crop, price now being \$1.50. The imported is quoted at \$1.85 a crate. Prices at the store range from 10 cents to 20 cents for a head, quality of all looking good if purchased while fresh.

Cabbage has taken another half-cent raise, with wholesale quotation now 4 1/2 cents. One store was selling cabbage Thursday at 2 cents, the lowest price noted. The heads were none too good in this instance. Other stores were selling cabbage at 4 cents and up.

California Imperial valley lettuce dropped 50 cents a crate to \$4.50. Lettuce sells for 10 cents a head and thereabouts at the stores. For the most part the quality is good.

The California celery is just coming onto the local market, with the quotation on the first shipments reaching \$6.00 a crate. California style pack local celery is quoted a dollar under this figure. Lake Labish celery is practically cleaned up. What little was on hand has been frozen. Store price for celery runs approximately 15 cents a stalk.

A few artichokes were noted Thursday, a small size selling at 10 cents retail.

Sweet potatoes remain at 5 cents a pound generally, although those offered now are considerably inferior to the sweets offered earlier.

Good parsnips cost 5 cents a pound at the store.

No change occurred in bulk rutabagas, carrots and turnips, all these selling at six pounds for 19 cents.

Green onions, shipped in from the Portland district, cost 5 cents a bunch and there are some radishes at the same figures. A good grade of dry onions may be purchased at 5 cents a pound in the stores.

Squash remained steady, most stores lumping the smaller varieties and selling them from 5 to 8 cents each to six for 25 cents.

### WHOLESALE PRICES OF ORANGES HIGHER

Oranges continue to furnish most of the excitement in the fruit market, with the larger sizes taking a considerable advance following the holiday trade. In the main advances were not reflected in retail selling Thursday and a good size orange may be bought in several stores at 43 cents a pound, with still a larger size at 53 cents.

Wholesale quotation on the 100's is now \$5.25, 75 cents above the earlier quotation. The 126's, 176's and 150's are all quoted at \$5.75 and the 252's are up 25 cents to \$5.50. Japanese oranges are quoted the same, \$2.35. Store price on these is close to 30 cents, or two dozen for 55 cents in some stores. Other small oranges sell at two dozen for 29 cents, 29 cents a dozen and 39 cents a dozen.

Florida grapefruit sells at 25 cents for three in some stores, however these are not as good as those offered a couple of weeks ago. Arizona grapefruit is cheaper, with a 50 cents wholesale drop and a figure of two for 15 cents at the stores.

Wholesale mark on cranberries is a dollar higher this week, at \$7.50. Stores prices remain about the same, with two pounds for 49 cents the usual charge.

No change occurred in the banana or lemon markets and apples remain about the same.

Grapes, either the red Tokays or the light Almeria variety, may be had at three pounds for 25 cents. The quantity is not large, but quality is good.
