

ENTIRELY NEW CAR


With advance reports from automobile manufacturing centers indicating a contemplated new high record production for 1929, it is rumored that, among the innovations scheduled for next year. is an entirely new car to be manufactured by one of the oldest companies in the industry.

The name Roosevelt, it is understood, has been decided upon for the new car after a period of consideration lasting nearly an entire year. The popular American ideals for which it stands were said to be the factors leading up to the selection of the name which. of course, conveys an impression of unmistakable importance to the public.

It is believed that the new car will not be introduced at the forthcoming 1929 automobile shows. but that its presentation will be withheld until early spring in order to give its producer an opportunity to incorporate in it a number of new and outstanding engi neering and manufacturing advances. The name of its manufacturer, however, probably will be made known before the time of the actual appearance of the car.


