Electric Motor Operates Onion Topper Cheaply

LABISH CENTER, Ore., Jan. 8. noon. the Portland Electric Power company tried an experiment of unusual interest to the Lake Labish farmers and all other onion growers, recently on the D. R. De

Gross place. Under the direction of Mr. De Gross, Newmyer replaced the three-horse power gas engine with a three-horse power electric motor. This will operate his onion topper at the mere cost of three cents per hour using 1.125 kilowatts per hour at a maximum

This motor would be useful for other farm appliances as well as the topping machine.

Onions Shipped
