Bill Introduced Here Would Appropriate \$50.000 for University

The "Mothers and Dads" bill, calling for an appropriation of \$50,000 for an infirmary at the University of Oregon, was introfuced in the house Tuesday under the names of Representative Lonergan of Multnomsh and Sen-ator Norblad of Clatsop county. It is understood that the "Oregon Dads" and others have already subscribed the \$50,000 called for to match the state appropriation, that construction on the building could begin at an early date should the measure pass both houses and be signed by the governor.

So far no organized opposition to the bill is evident in either house, while the attitude of the governor has not been determined. Governor Patterson listened attentatively to the delegation of mothers when they called here recently but did not commit himself.

The report of the joint commit-tee which visited the university last week is expected to have considerable influence on the way the measure will be received when it comes up for final action. This report is expected soon. Legislators on the trip thoroughly investigated the precent infirmary. which has capacity for but 13 and which is housed in a building declared to be a firstrap and in need of repairs.


