

DE GUIRE NOW FACING CHARGE

Giving Liquor to Minor Alleged of Witness in Recent Jackson Case

The career of Pete De Guire, who was a star witness in the recent case *Estate vs. Johnson*, but who was accused by the prosecution of changing his story with the result that Johnson was acquitted of his moonshining charge, will face trial on his own account at the next term of court. The grand jury returned an indictment against him Saturday for contributing to the delinquency of a minor. More specifically, the charge states that De Guire gave a gallon of moonshine to Lester Wampole, a minor. It is understood that certain evidence given by De Guire at the time of Johnson's trial will be used against him. He is quoted as having said that young Wampole discovered the still that was then in question and that he gave Wampole a gallon of liquor and "told him to keep quiet."

Seven other indictments were returned by the grand jury Saturday, as follows:

John Buechler, charged with non-support of his wife.

John H. Chiles, charged with non-support of his six-year-old son.

Harry B. Williams, charged with forgery of a \$24 check.

Joseph Lorraine and E. F. Yarbrough, charged with burglary in a railroad roundhouse at Silverton January 14. They are said to have taken some 200 pounds of scrap brass.

Thomas E. Thompson, trick parachute jumper during the state fair here last fall, charged with forgery of a \$20 check.

Alfred Enes, charged with grand larceny in connection with an auto theft, January 5.

James H. Whitley, charged with forgery of a \$1.50 check.

Not true bills were returned against June Drake of Silverton, involved in a photographer's altercation some time ago and accused of defacing a building, and Henry Esau, accused of burglary not in a dwelling. The tentative charge against Esau had involved theft of candy, tobacco and cigars from a room at the Senator hotel January 2.

Bible Infallible "This is a move of self-preservation that has been forced upon us," he says. "Some folks probably think we are a lot of long-haired fanatics and we're not, as you can see. We're just out to protect our

own interests. We claim that the Bible is infallible and anyhow, no one yet has been able to disprove it. On the other hand, evolution is just a theory and fast-dying at that.
