### State Convention to Open in Salem April 18, 1500 Delegates Expected

The tentative program for the state Christian Endeavor convention to be held in Salem April 18-21, provides a wide variety of interest for the visiting delegates. Last week the chamber of commerce sent a letter of welcome to officers of Endeavor societies over the state, telling them that Salem is known as a city of homes, schools and churches, and that everything will be done to aid the success of the convention. Local directors expect a registration of 1500 or more.

The opening session of the convention will be held Thursday evening, April 18, when delegates will be welcomed, convention officials introduced and committees appointed. Friday morning will be filled with Bible study classes, assembly singing, and discussion of religious literature.

Friday afternoon, after a brief convention session, there will be a parade of the delegates and other visitors, and a "sightseeing tour of the city. A junior workers' dinner will be given in the evening. The program for Saturday evening holds a variety of interesting features. Following the election of officers and budget raising, there will be held the Intermediate Oratorical contest. Invitations for next year's convention will also be presented at this time.

## SACRED CONCERT AT FIRST M. E.

P. Waldo Davis to Play On Triple Golden Chimes Tonight at 7:30 o'clock

A sacred concert on the Triple Golden Chimes will be given in the First Methodist church Sunday evening by P. Waldo Davis and Herschel DeMoss Davis.
