

STANDS UP; SAYS "NO"

Speaker Hamilton Admits Bill Has Merit, Asks Withdrawal

FREE BOOKS MUST WAIT

For the first time this session, and probably the first time in many sessions, the author of a house bill stood up and asked permission to withdraw his measure because he feared it might pass. This author was none less than Speaker Hamilton himself, and the bill he withdrew Wednesday was H. B. 473, which would have set the school districts up in the book business. Under provisions of the act the school district would purchase all textbooks used in high and elementary grades and re-sell them to the pupils.

He learned that it would require a large capital outlay from each district of any size in order to finance the plan. Then he also learned that the average price at which books were sold was but 25 per cent more than the wholesale price. Some expense would naturally fall to the district for handling purposes so the saving would not be very great. For these reasons, chiefly because the state is not at present in shape to finance such a plan, the bill was withdrawn.

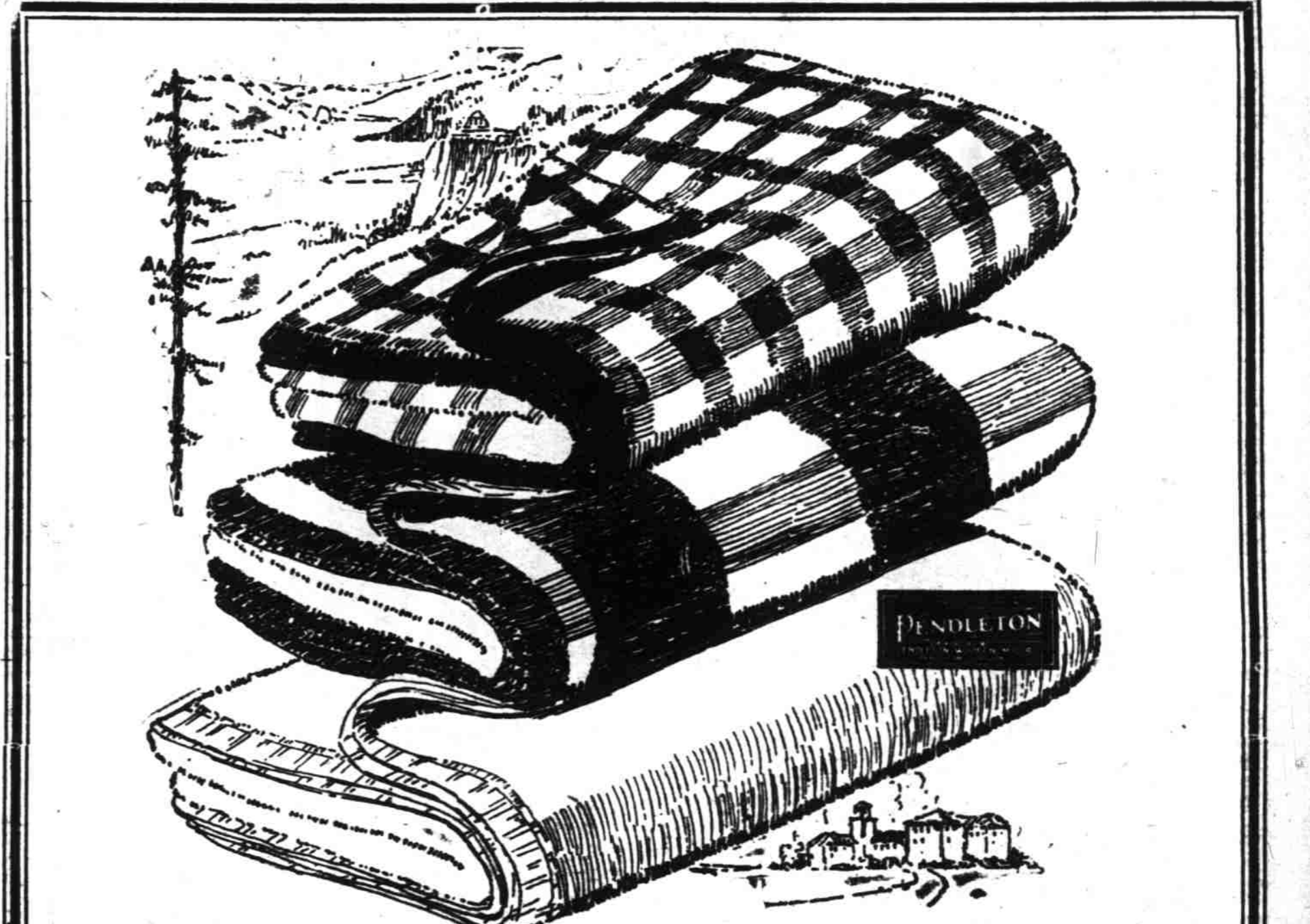
