

OREGON NORMAL TO OFFER 4-YEAR TERM

MONMOUTH, Feb. 28.—Arrangements are now being made to place Oregon Normal school on an equal basis with teachers' colleges in other states by offering an additional two year course for elementary teachers.

The first of these courses in advanced work will be available for teachers this summer, and the announcement of the advanced courses will occur in the summer bulletin to be issued in two weeks.

Formerly Oregon has been one of the very few states in the union that has not offered a four year training course for elementary teachers, and this important step forward marks a milestone on the educational road of progress of this institution.

A special assembly was called Monday morning to enable stu-

ents and faculty of the Oregon Normal school to see and hear Sidney Landon's interpretation of four writers. The first was Victor Hugo, known as "The Brain of the City of Paris." Putting on his makeup, Mr. Landon told the story of the great French author and after turning his back a moment to adjust the wig, he appeared as Hugo delivering an address in Paris on his 50th birthday.
