

GLEE CONCERT DATE IS FIXED

Willamette University Club Will Present Its Annual Songfest March 25

The men's glee club of Willamette university, with the aid of alumni members, will present its Salem concert on March 25 at the Oregon theatre. Besides alumni members of the club, Miss Mina Hager will also appear in the concert. Miss Hager is a former pupil of Prof. E. W. Hobson of the Willamette school of music. She has sung with the Chicago Grand Opera company and the Berlin Philharmonic orchestra, but is also known as a soloist at the famous Hollywood Bowl programs.

Since the concert will be given during Passion week, the program will be of different nature than the usual glee club numbers. Many classical and semi-classical selections will be presented. Besides the 28 members of the glee club, F. M. Elenkinop, Everett Craven, William Wright, A. A. Schramm and R. D. Barton will participate in the program. Miss Edith Findley, who accompanied the club on its concert tour is not expected to be accompanied at this program because of illness which has kept her out of school the past two weeks.

Paul Geddes, manager of the club, stated that he felt the different type of program would be an acceptable innovation. Alumni members of the glee club have expressed considerable interest in the enterprise.

LOCAL GROCER DIES AT ALBANY, REPORT

Peter Bostrack, owner of a neighborhood grocery on Mill and South 25th street, died in Albany, Wednesday morning at the age of 69 years. He had been ill about a month. Mr. Bostrack had been in the grocery business in Salem and Albany for the last 12 or 14 years. Funeral services will be held at the Fort Miller funeral parlors in Albany Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, with burial to follow at the Riverview cemetery there.

Mr. Bostrack was a native of Wisconsin, coming here from St. Louis about 1900. He was a member

of the Lutheran church. Besides his widow, Mrs. Anna Bostrack of Salem, he is survived by six daughters and three sons, as follows: Mrs. Irvin Hood of Albany, Mrs. William Weidacker of Talbot; Mrs. William Thomas and Mrs. Carl Martin of Salem; Miss Mamie Bostrack of Marion; Miss Tonia of Silverton; Russell of Albany; and Sherman and John of Salem.

SUMMER THEOLOGY SCHOOL IS PLANNED

Announcement was made Thursday of the Kimball School of Theology summer session for young ministers. The session will be held June 11-21 for young ministers of Oregon and Washington who have not had the benefit of seminary training.

Professors J. D. McCormick, C. I. Andrews, E. S. Hammond and G. M. Keeter of the Kimball faculty will be on the summer session faculty. Other members of the summer session faculty will include the Rev. S. D. Johnson of Salem, W. G. R. Dann of Ritzville, Washington; the Rev. J. E. Purdy and Rev. Roy L. Sprague of Tacoma, and the Rev. J. L. Rentfro of Cheney, Washington. The Rev. Rentfro is a former Willamette professor.

The course of study will include methods of evangelism, social relations, Biblical history and Sunday school administration.

REHEARING ASKED
A petition for a rehearing in the case of the Yamhill Electric company vs. the City of McMinnville, was filed with the supreme court here Thursday. The case involves the right of the city of McMinnville to extend its electric lines beyond the city limits and to conduct the utility for profit in competition with privately owned utilities. The supreme court in a recent opinion upheld the city's right in this respect. The new move is regarded here as a preliminary to an appeal to the United States supreme court.

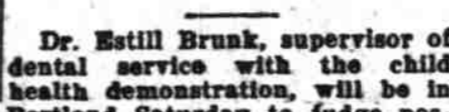

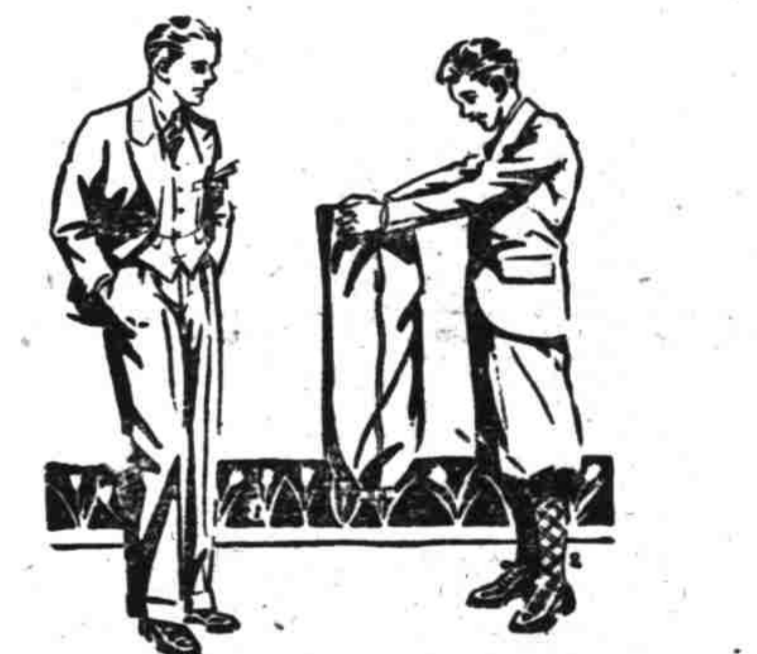
