

SUCCESSOR SOUGHT FOR FRED KENDALL

Governor Hears Visitors but Makes No Comment on His Plans

A. K. Downs, John Gill and Robert Silnkoff, all of Portland, conferred with Governor Patterson here Thursday with relation to the appointment of a successor to Fred P. Kendall, member of the state fish commission. Mr. Kendall died recently in Portland. Neither Governor Patterson nor the visitors would make any statement at the conclusion of the conference.

Other visitors at the executive department included Roy Rittner of Pendleton, ex-state senator, and Denton Burdick of Portland, member of the house of representatives in the state legislature. Rittner and Burdick said their business with the governor was of a personal nature.

Governor Patterson said he had not yet determined when he would announce Mr. Kendall's successor. He has received a large number of letters and telegrams endorsing various candidates.

NEW PILOT COMMISSIONERS
