LIEAD lettuce is a new industry on the land for the Salem 1 1 district; but it gives promise of doubling this year; with possibly a hundred cars, though only the spring crop is produced to any extent in commercial quantities.

The pioneering already done points the way to big expansion, on the irrigated lands of the Santiam bottoms, with a fall as well as a spring crop. Also, a crop for July and August markets, from the lands to the west, near the ocean.

Here is an opportunity for the Salem chamber of commerce and similar organizations in this section to secure a gigantic new industry, by broadcasting the fact that we can produce here three seasonal crops of this vegetable, of high quality, fit for any market.

Instead of a possible 100 cars this year, we may turn off thousands of cars annually, bringing hundreds of thousands and finally millions of dollars hither, some of the returns from long distances; and requiring comparative small acreage, for head lettuce is an intensified crop.




