

MARKET STRIKE IS IN RETREAT

Call Money Again Mounts to Ten Per Cent Causing Prices to Drop

NEW YORK, April 9.—(AP)—The stock market continued its orderly retreat today, along with somewhat broader front, as call money again mounted to 10 per cent and rumors filtered through Wall Street that leading bull operators had decided the time had come to yield to the federal reserve board in its struggle to curtail speculative credit.

Selling was in considerably larger volume than yesterday, but the day's business was moderate, with total sales of 3,629,340. This, however, was a gain of approximately 900,000 shares over the previous session. Some three score issues were driven to new lows for 1929, or to within a point or so of their previous bottom figures for the year.

Kolster Radio at New Low Figure
Kolster radio dropped about 8 points to a new low of 40 1/2, as it rallied about three points. Intellectual telephone losses more than seven points, and regained two. Radio Corp. closed at 93, off nearly four. Wright Aero dropped 12 points, and regained about half its loss. Rostia insurance lost 4 points in a narrow market. Columbia carbon, Commercial solvents, Alis Chalmers, and National Cash register, were among issues yielding from four to eight points.

Psychological Effect
While there is no connection between this case and the St. Louis and O'Fallon railway valuation case, the decision had the psychological effect of damaging the optimism which is the product of a favorable decision in the latter case has been regarded, and rails general were liquidated. New York Central, Delaware and Hudson, Canadian Pacific, New Haven, Union Pacific, and others sold off at times from about three to six points.
