

YANKEE PLANS NOT BROADCAST

American Delegation Decides to Retain Details Until Last Moment

GENOA, April 25.—(AP)—The American delegation to the preparatory commission for a disarmament conference has decided against immediate delivery to Great Britain, France, Italy and Japan of the memorandum now being prepared to explain the technical purport of the American formula of equivalent tonnage.

It was deemed wiser to circulate the memorandum only on the eve of discussion of naval questions by the preparatory commission. The American experts have been working on the memorandum since Ambassador Hugh S. Gibson disclosed the general terms of the American policy.

Another development on naval matters was the distinct drift of both British and American delegations to the belief that the proposed naval conference had better be merged with the second Washington naval parity due in 1931. By this arrangement the five great naval powers could mould a treaty for reduction in cruisers, destroyers and submarines while re-examining requirements of modification of the Washington treaty on battleships and aircraft carriers in the light of scientific development.

Observers here tonight debated whether an understanding between Great Britain and the United States might not first be sought on the subject of cruises. In British circles it was believed that if cruiser proportions were settled, the remainder of auxiliary war-craft questions could be disposed of.

Although no negotiations have been started it would not astonish observers if the British admiralty and American naval authorities later quietly got together on this problem. England foresees no difficulty in arranging naval matters with France after she has reached a preliminary understanding with the United States.

Master Criminal is Being Investigated by Police as His Inquest is Postponed

CHICAGO, April 25.—(AP)—The inquest into the death of Dr. Frank Brady, dentist, shot to death in his office last night, was adjourned tonight until May 7, in order that police may delve further into the mysterious double life of the man whom they described as one of the "shrewdest criminals in police annals."

Ostensibly a dentist and chemist of reputable standing, Brady, whose true name was Frank Vadjina, was the brains of the notorious "Midwest Fernekes" band of robbers, police believe.

"We have never been able to obtain direct evidence, connecting Brady with the Fernekes crimes," Lieutenant Stewart Moss told the coroner's jury, "but we know he was closely in touch with the gang."

Fernekes, whose wife was Brady's foster mother, is serving a life sentence in Joliet prison for a score of bank robberies which resulted in several killings. He figured in an attempt to bomb the county jail while incarcerated there.

FEDERAL BOMB HITS REBEL TROOP TRAIN

NAGO, Sonora, April 25.—(AP)—A federal bombing plane cut a rebel Mexican transport train in two with a well aimed bomb within sight of this loyal stronghold late today. The front half of the train proceeded rapidly down the tracks leaving several cars stranded.

The aviator, who took off when the train appeared on the horizon, dropped six bombs, making one direct hit. The bomb fell between two cars, derailing one. The aviator said approximately 1,000 rebel soldiers were aboard the train, but he was uncertain whether any had been injured in the blast.

The train was carrying troops from the west coast to the Agua Prieta sector, eventually to be used in reinforcing the rebel detachment in Pulpito pass.

Federal planes also bombed the fortifications at Nogales and Agua Prieta today. No casualties were reported in either attack. At Nogales rebels were seen struggling barbed wire around shell holes, incorporating them in the trench system.

CHICAGO, April 25.—(AP)—Appointment of Robert Maynard Hutchins, as president of the University of Chicago was announced tonight by Harold H. Swift, president of the board of trustees. Mr. Hutchins, who was dean of the law school of Yale university, is the youngest president of any major American university. He was 30 years old last January.
