Spanish Ship Rams Bow Into Smaller Vessel With Much Damage NEW YORK, May 2-(AP)-

The Cristobal Colon of the Spanish royal mail, with 1,000 passengers for Spain, rammed an anchored freighter in the ship channel at quarantine today, plowing 15 feet into the smaller vessel's hold. The freighter, the River Orontes of the American-Levant line

inbound from Algeria with cargo, had dropped anchor in a gray haze for medical inspection when the passenger liner, more than twice the freighter's size, slid out of the mist and cut her open. The River Orntes took water

like a broken cup but the liner's prow was fast in her side and though she settled fast at the stern she stayed afloat while wireless messages brought coast guard, fire boats and harbor tugs to the rescue.

No effort was made in the deep waters of the lower harbor's ship channel to pull the locked craft apart, lest the freighter sink, but after some hours maneuvering and consultation the captain of the River Orntes requested the Cristobal Colon to nose him over into the shallow where he could get a mud bottom under him.

The collision occurred not long after noon and by four o'clock the freighter had been pushed into the comparatively shallow waters of Day Ridge flats and was still settling, the water being up Tel. 2242 to her midship deckline: Of the crew of 37 all but 12 were taken off in tugs. The ships separated soon afterward. The liner, a great gash in her bow returned to her pier under her own steam. Messages to the offices of both
