

STOCK MARKET IN CONFUSION

Quotations Very Unsteady as New Developments Are Awaited

NEW YORK, May 3.—(AP)—The stock market flourished about in confusion today, as bulls struggled to retain control of the market, against a tide of selling inspired by fears of large increase in Federal reserve brokers loans and swelled by sharp breaks in a few recent favorites...

While this showing was somewhat more favorable than had been generally expected, the exchange released its monthly compilation of total member borrowings which was distinctly disappointing, showing a reduction during April of only \$29,527,013 from the record established at the end of March of \$3,804,457,408.
