



Fears that China wil adopt the Russian version of communism appear now to be groundless, Prof. Leland H. Chapin of Willamette university declares in an address at the Salem Rotary club luncheon Wednesday, basing his opinion on his own observations while teaching at a college in Canton at the time that Russian envoys were making their strongest efforts to implant their ideas

Dr. Sun Yat Sen, original leader of the nationalist group in China, welcomed the Russians because the United States and Great Britain had refused to send military and political advisors, but he declared that Chinese traditions would make it impossible for the people to adopt communism. Principal barriers, he said, were the tradition that the learned citizens should rule, and the ingrained
