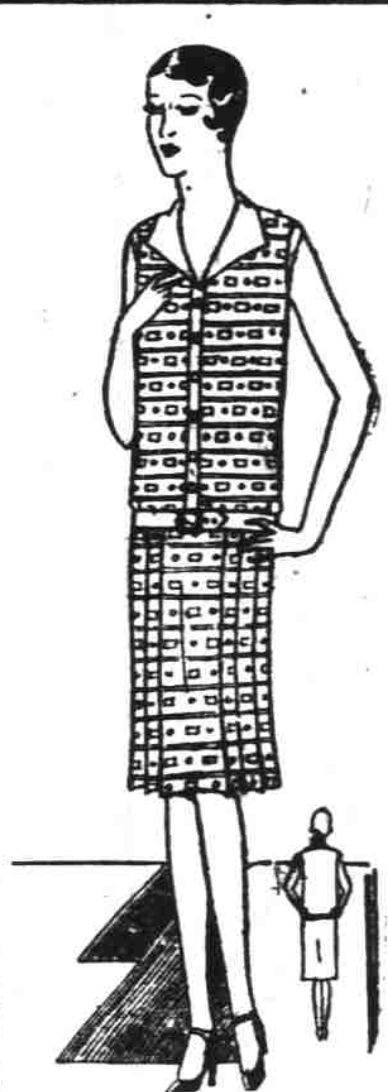

### LELAND CHAPIN EXPLAINS CHINA

Address Given Before Salem Rotary Club; Russian Influence Scouted

Fears that China will adopt the Russian version of communism appear now to be groundless. Prof. Leland H. Chapin of Willamette university declares in an address at the Salem Rotary club luncheon Wednesday, basing his opinion on his own observations while teaching at a college in Canton at the time that Russian envoys were making their strongest efforts to implant their ideas there.

Dr. Sun Yat Sen, original leader of the nationalist group in China, welcomed the Russians because the United States and Great Britain had refused to send military and political advisors, but he declared that Chinese traditions would make it impossible for the people to adopt communism. Principal barriers, he said, were the tradition that the learned citizens should rule, and the ingrained spirit of ancestor worship.

The people of Canton accepted communism in the abstract, and expressed hatred of British imperialism and American capitalism but couldn't identify that feeling with their British and American friends, but when Borodin, leader of the communist delegation, moved to Hankow and began preaching there, trouble started.

Since 92 per cent of the Chinese are illiterate, the oft repeated slogans inaugurated by the communists had widespread effect; but after 50 of the communists were driven out and bribery was proven against those who remained, the movement died quickly, Prof. Chapin said.

### Rates Restored At Request Of Service Group

The public service commission

Thursday prevailed upon the Southern Pacific company and Oregon Electric to restore commutation fares in effect prior to May 1 between Portland and Beaverton and Portland and Aloha. These rates will remain in effect pending an investigation of a new tariff filed recently by the

railroad corporations. This tariff proposes a slight increase in fares. A new tariff also has been filed by the Pacific Stages, which operates in the Beaverton and Aloha territory.

### High School Clubs Given Charter Idea

An innovation in the manner in which student clubs and societies at the Salem high school are organized will be in order next fall, if an amendment to the student body constitution now being drafted and to come before the students at the annual election this month is passed. The proposed change will stipulate that all student body organizations work under a charter granted by the student body.

It is argued such a procedure will give uniformity of management and will center responsibility for the numerous clubs and societies. It will also give the student body some control over the finances of the various groups. A companion amendment will provide for a charter committee, composed probably of one faculty member and two members of the student council.

While new to the local high school, such an arrangement of center responsibility has been in effect in other high schools and has worked successfully.
