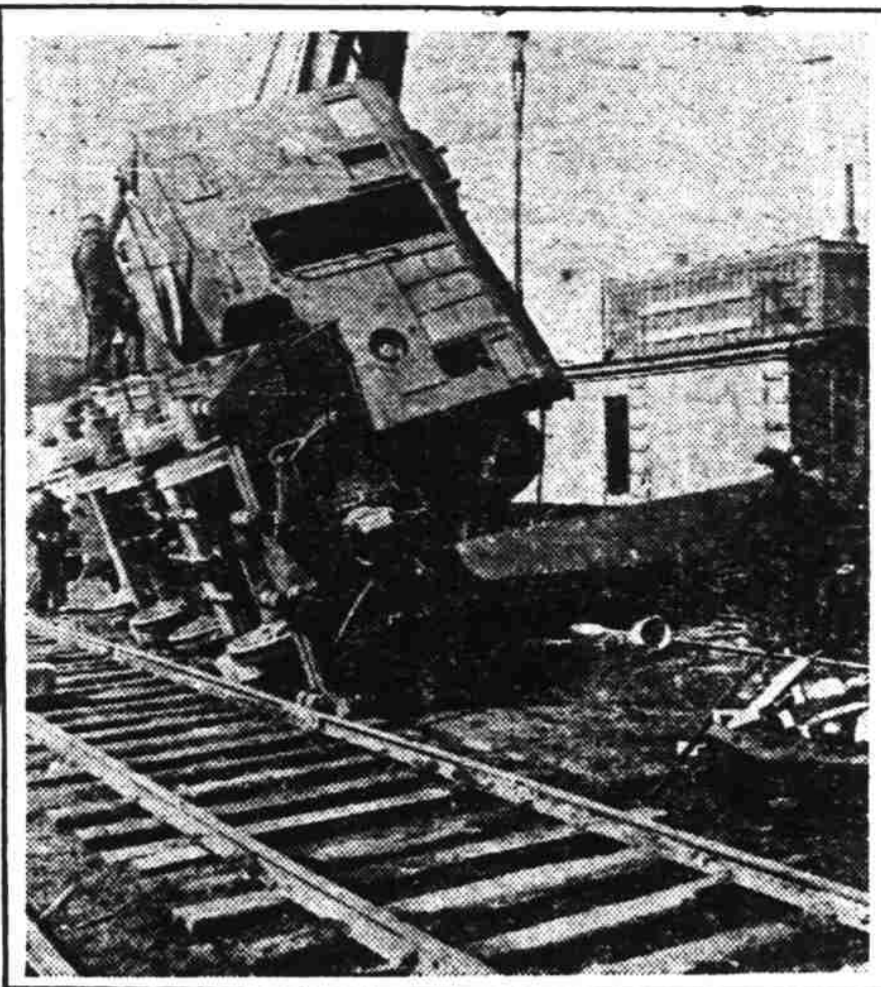


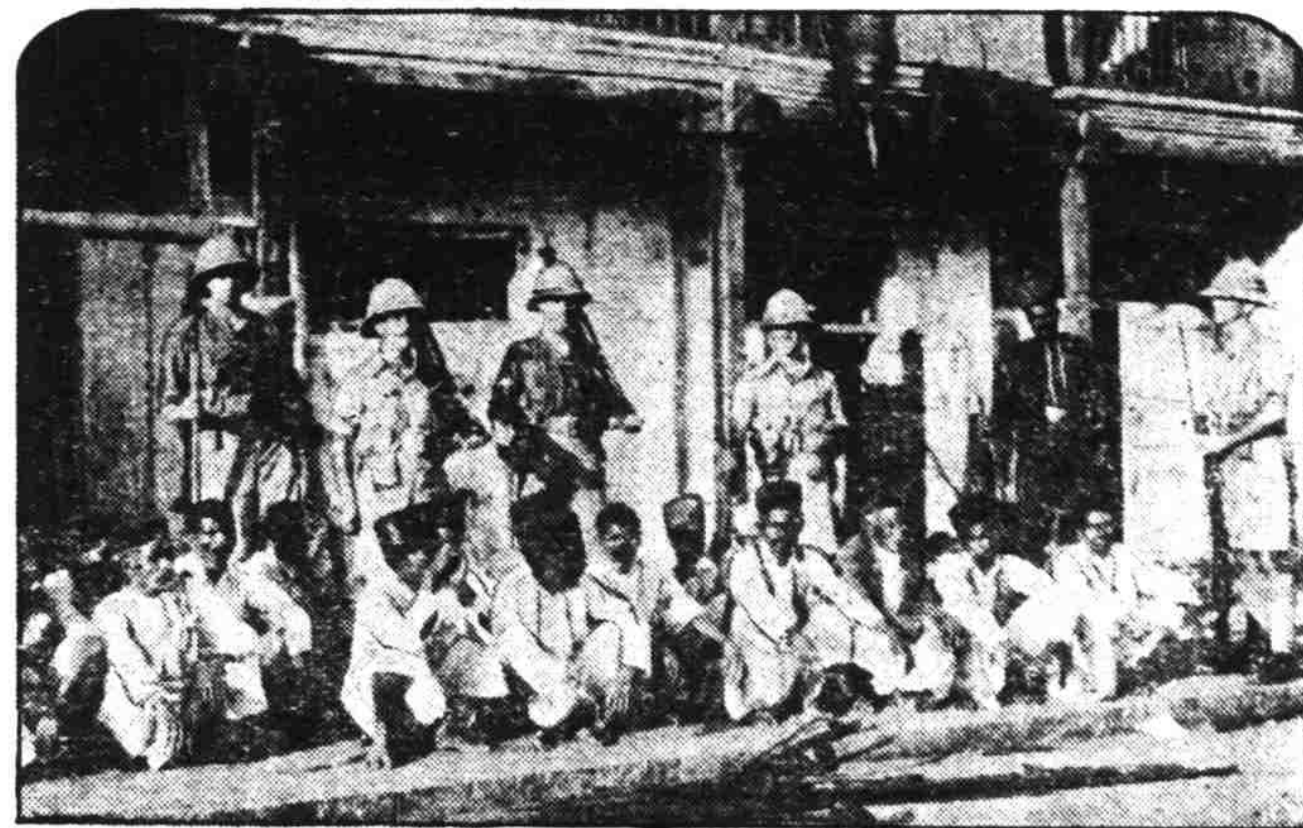

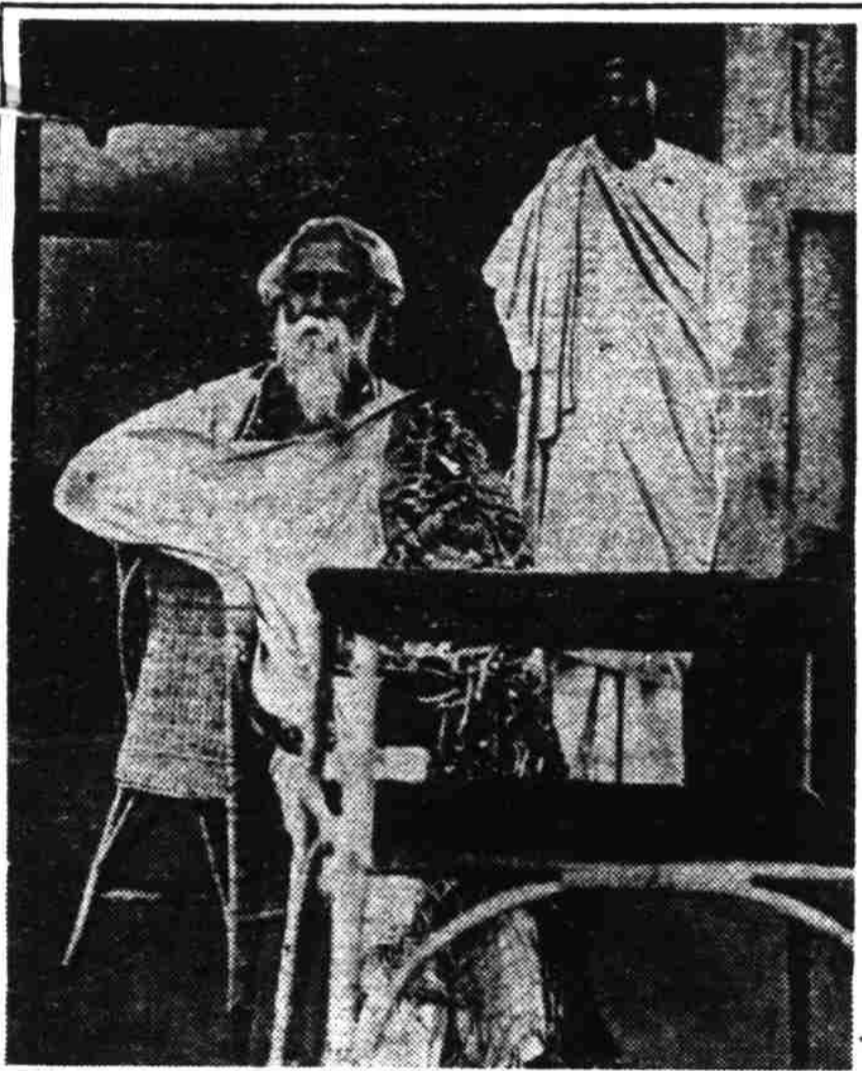
TOPPLING CRANE carrying six tons of lumber for new Merchandise Mart in Chicago kills two.

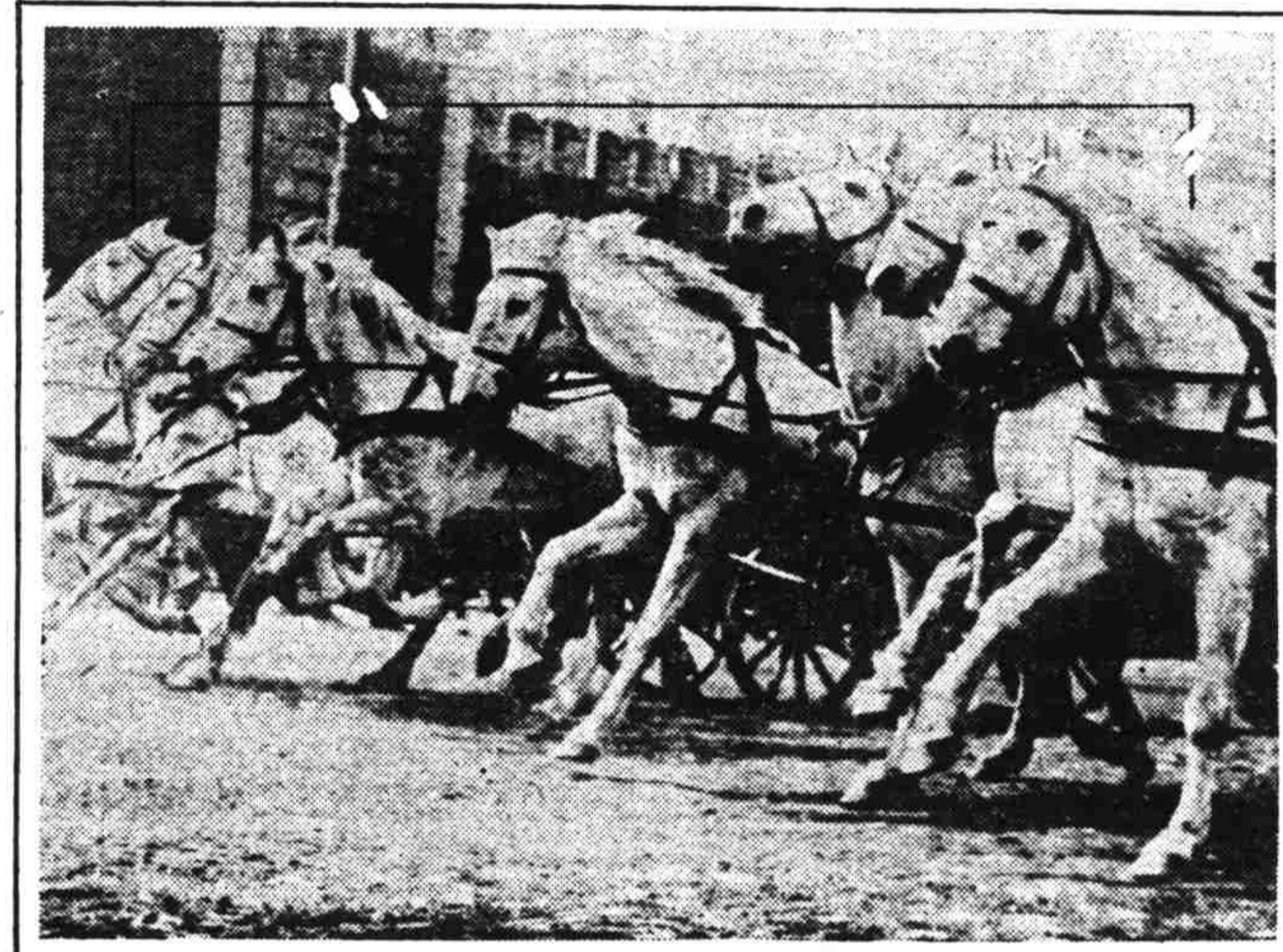
MOVIES CLAIM RABINDRANATH TAGORE, famous poet-philosopher of India, shown posing for the camera in front of his house in Calcutta.
