



California Champion Makes Course in One Above Par Yesterday

NEWLAND Associated Press Sports Writer DEL MONTE, Cal., May 28-(AP)-With a dazzling 73, one above par for the newly rebuilt Pebble Beach course, Johnny Mc-Hugh, lanky San Francisco youngster, sounded a warning today to the rest of the field qualifying for the California amateur golf championship that he is prepared to defend his title.

McHugh's fine score not only establishes a record on the course on which the national amateur championship will be played next September, but also landed him in a tie for medal honors with Fay Coleman, Los Angeles lad, who also turned in 153 for the 36 hole qualifying trials. Coleman had 76 today and 77 yesterday. The tie between the pair probably will be played off after the championship finals.

In his round today, McHugh showed a firm all round game. His irons were especially accurate and on the third and fourth holes he laid approaches dead to the pin. On the fourteenth he dropped a seven foot putt. He missed 20-foot putt on the eighteenth by two inches for a par 72.
