BEND WILDCAT TAMED BY FOX

Independence Youth Awarded Technical Knockout Over Opponent

A terrific right swing that landed just over Allie Taylor's heart and put that game little battler out of commission even though it didn't shake his indomitable fighting spirit, proved the supremacy of Ted Fox, pride of Independence, over Fox, pride of Independence, on the second time at the armory Wednesday night.

Suffering immeasurably, Taylor strove valiantly to rise while Referee Tom Luntitt counted to nine, then he wobbled to his feet, but was plainly helpless and Luntitt gave the fight to Fox on a technical knockout.

End Comes Suddenly And Unexpectedly

All that happened quite suddenly and unexpectedly in the tenth round, after nine vicious rounds in which Fox with ripping lefts to the face scored more clean punches, but Taylor did more damage in the infighting and frequently rocked the Independence boy with rights to the jaw.

Taylor took the second round and possibly the sixth, but Fox won all the rest excepting the first, which was even. The Bend scrapper never allowed Fox to use his flashy style; but it wasn't true, as some Fox partisans claimed, that Taylor hung on and stalled. With his short reach, Taylor had to get in close to do anything. That's Taylor's style, and he would be a chump to abandon it.

Kileen And Ambrose Stage Genuine Bout

Jackie Kileen and Floyd Ambrose put on the best scrap that any of the 118 pounders have provided this year. Ambrose tried a new set of tactics on Kileen, and they nearly worked. The local boy kept dancing away and swinging haymakers with his right every time Kileen came in close, and some of them landed with plenty of force.

Kileen tore Ambrose's face to shreds, and in the last round the plucky Ambrose was so nearly out that he couldn't straighten up; but he kept on swinging like a maniac, and drew a tremendous ovation. Kileen won the decision.

First Three Scraps All Held Knockouts

The first three fights were all classed as knockouts, but there wasn't much to it. Jackie Woods finally got a chance to use his speed against an opponent who didn't have him outclassed, and he made the most of it. He knocked Jackie Nelson out with a left to the chin and a right to the body early in the second round.

Willie Brown of Independence won a technical knockout over Jack Kuhn in the first round. The fight between Carl Rocco and Joe Burrell was a scream. Rocco hit Burrell a glancing blow on the head in the second round, and Burrell flopped in a heap on the floor; he looked like he was out "cold," but when the referee called "ten," he bounced up, apparently as fresh as a daisy, and there was supposed to be one more four round fight, but one of the principals, Russ Greene, went out to get something and never came back.

TRIGO WINS AT EPSOM DOWNS

Favorites Defeated in Classic Turf Contest in Great Britain

EPSOM DOWNS, Eng., June 5.—(AP).—Fortune turned back on the experts today and sent Trigo, an unclaimed Irish colt, out to win the derby, the world's greatest horse race, before a vast multitude of Epsom Downs.

Scantly backed at 33 to 1, this courageous boy, owned by an Irish merchant from Ulster, William Barnett, triumphed over a field of 26 of Britain's choicest three year olds. The three joint favorites — Craxford, Hunter's Moon and Mr. Jinks — and many other more fancied horses failed in the exhausting test for premier turf honors over the famous mile and a half irregular.

A length and a half behind Trigo came Walter Gay, Lord Woolavington's colt, which almost until the hour of the race was counted a doubtful starter and was quoted at odds of 100 to 8. Two more lengths behind came Brizenz, another comparatively unknown, which dashed home to take down third money. Brizenz, Somerville Tailors' colt, went to the post at long odds of 50 to 1.

The Prince of Wales with his sister and brother-in-law was among the host of spectators — some said a million but really nobody counted them — who saw the favorites finish behind Trigo's flying feet. Hunter's Moon, Lord Derby's colt, made the best showing of the highly touted candidates, but
