

PROPERTY WILL BE DEEDED OVER

W. F. Norman Resigns His
Place; Council Regrets
His Departure

WOODBURN, June 6. — The Woodburn city council held its regular meeting in the city hall Tuesday evening.

The regular routine of business followed the call to order, but the main business was the report of the standing committee. The property committee reported that several deals in regard to the city's interest in the deinking properties were going through or were to go through.

The city accepted an offer from J. R. Housewert for a payment of \$250 by Housewert for the city's interest in his property and a quitclaim deed. They also accepted an offer by C. C. Geer of \$325.39 cash, payable before June 10, for a quit claim deed to his property. Settlement for the McGuire property had not yet been made, as the property must be handled through the Willamette Valley Mortgage and Loan Co.

It was decided that deed decided upon the payment of \$143.56 by any of the interests and the settlement of interest on the said sum the city would issue a quit claim deed by the recorder and mayor.

A party, Studer, asked to rent lots 5, 6, 7, and 8 in Chapelle addition from the city, but before he can do so the city must eject the present occupant of the

property. They decided to eject the present occupant. A bill of over \$4200 court costs on the N. Miller case was laid over until the next meeting.

It was moved that the street commissioner construct a crosswalk at 5th and Grant streets. Orders were given to publish the street commissioner's acceptance in the Woodburn Independent. W. F. Norman, four years a member of the city council, read his resignation. The council expressed regrets at his leaving and laid the resignation on the table until the next meeting, June 16.

The finance committee read numerous bills for city expenses and the council moved to pay the bills signed by this committee as read. The final business was the discussion of the high board fence around junk, such as old automobiles, etc., within the city limits. Some of the citizens objected to this ordinance but a majority of people are getting rid of their junk.
