Touching Story Told of Tenement Life in Bligh Show

Mail Service to Be Extended on 2 Rural Routes

Extension of service on two additional Salem mail routes has just been announced from the local postoffice, to be effective July 1. Five families will be served by each extension. Route seven, on which C. W. Brasher is carrier, will be made seven-tenths of a mile longer, or a total of 3.4 miles. The extension is in the Howell Prairie region, between the Silverton Pratum road. Route four will be extended eight-tenths of a mile and retrace, making a total of 33.6 miles. A. W. Striker is carrier.

NEWPORT, Ore., June 29.—(AP)—The United States destroyer Farragut arrived here today and will remain over July 4. The Newport chamber of commerce and city officials telegraphed Senator McNary to have the destroyer assigned here during the meeting of the state editorial association and permission has been granted by the navy department.

The destroyer carries 108 men and seven officers. The United States dredge Col. P. S. Michie is also in port.

PRUNE PLANT WILL GO UP; COST \$11,000

One of the last building permits to be issued in June was given Saturday to the Salem Cooperative Prune Growers association for the construction of a two-story prune packing plant. The building will be 80 by 100 feet with an 80-foot frontage on the Southern California tracks at 18th and Howard streets. Approximate cost of the building will be \$11,000; this figure does not include extensive equipment which will be placed in it.

Construction is scheduled to begin July 8, and will be complete not later than September 1. It was announced by C. A. Ratcliffe, secretary of the company. This will assure its being ready to handle the 1929 fruit crop. Herbert Babb will be construction superintendent, and J. H. West, formerly with the Drager fruit company, will be plant foreman. Estimated capacity of the plant is 5,000,000 boxes.

Former Kimball Head Accepts St. Paul Call

Rev. Eugene C. Hickman, former president of Kimball School of Theology, and for the past 32

months pastor of the Kenwood Methodist Episcopal church at Milwaukee, Wis., has accepted a call to the Hamline Methodist church at St. Paul, Minn., according to word received here. His new pastorate will be effective September 1.

During Mr. Hickman's charge at Milwaukee, a \$250,000 church building was erected and dedicated last winter, with all funds for the building provided before dedication. More than 300 members were added during his pastorate. Mr. Hickman was graduated from Hamline University 20 years ago.

Water, Very Cold Water, Now in Main

Water, so cold that it might have come right out of the family refrigerator, greeted North Salem residents when they turned on the faucets in their homes Saturday morning.

Most of the couldn't figure it out, unless they had read The Statesman's story Friday morning to the effect that the Madison street well would be put to use Saturday.

That is what happened, and the householders were agreeably surprised. Officials of the Oregon-Washington Water Service company reported that the well water raised the pressure in North Salem

mains to 60 pounds and then on up to 85, where it remained constant until the plant was shut down temporarily to make some minor adjustments. The well is scheduled to furnish 400 gallons per minute, an extremely noticeable addition to the supply of water in that section of the city.

The company is planning to drill one more well at a point further south.

LEE EYERLY ADDS TO HIS EQUIPMENT
