The Salem contingent will leave the Y. M. C. A. in private cars as promptly as possible after 2 o'clock Saturday, August 31. A charge of \$1.75 round trip will be made for those without cars. Individuals must take their own sleeping and eating outfits but food will be furnished and prepared by the club, beginning

with 7 o'clock dinner Saturday evening and including the Monday noon meal at a price of \$1.75 for each person. Burton Clary is the chef.

All who intend to go should register at the "Y" as promptly as possible and not later than Thursday evening. The committee requests that the charges be paid at the time of registration. Further information may be secured at the "Y" or from Mrs. E. M. Hoffnell, who is to be leader of the Salem group.

DePoe bay is about 100 miles from Salem on the Roosevelt coast highway between Taft and Otter Hook in the heart of a rough, rugged, unsettled section, heavily timbered and difficult of access before completion of the highway last year. Points of interest in the neighborhood are Whale Cove, once the home port of many whales, Boiler bay, the grave-yard of steam boilers of an ancient wreck, beautiful marine gardens, Rocky creek and DePoe bay bridges, two of the most beautiful in the state highway system, the Devil's Punch Bowl and the new Otter Crest and Devil's Punch Bowl state park sites, Cape Foulweather, Yaquina head and the lighthouse, Siletz bay with its fishing boats and ocean going tugs with great log
