(Continued from Page 8.) for another eight days; we are to stay here that much longer and it is good here.

Naturally I have to stand the others drinks at the canteen. We are all a little bit drunk. I become gloomy. I will be away six weeks-that is lucky of course, but what may happen before I get back? Shall I meet all these fellows again? Already Haie has gone-who will the next be?

As we drink, I look at each of them in turn. Albert sits beside me and smokes, he is silent, we have always been together-opposite squats Kat, with his drooping shoulders, his broad thumb and calm voice-Muller with the protruding teeth and the booming Tel. 1727 laugh; Tjaden with his mousy eyes; Leer who has grown a full Tel. 2830 beard and looks at least forty.

Over us hangs a dense cloud of smoke. Where would a soldier be without tobacco? The canteen is his refuge, and here is far more than a drink, it is a token that a Tel. 615 man can move his limbs and stretch in safety. We do it ceremonially, we stretch our legs out in front of us and spit deliberately, that is the only way. How it all rises up before a man when he is going away the next morning! Next morning after I have been
