Italians Conquer Malaria by Patterning After General Goethals

By ANDRUE BERDING

(Associated Press Staff Writer) ROME-(AP)-Rome's enemy for centuries, which wasted armies, reduced cities and decimated the population time and againdeadly, dreaded malaria-is fast being reduced to a mere shadow of its former force.

Figures just issued by the governor's health office show how complete has been the victory of the sanitary forces. From time immemorial millions of mosquitoes rose from swampy lands around Rome and piled up the malaria death list among the inhabitants.

But there were only nine deaths in 1928, and 1,057 cases. Two years ago there were 14 deaths and 1,240 cases. And ten years ago the deaths were in the hundreds and the cases in the tens of thousands.

The struggle of the governor of Rome corresponds to that of General Goethals when he began to build the Panama Canal. And it is meeting with the same succes ..

Some years ago all the dangerous swamps and ponds around Rome were drained. The swarms of mosquitoes which bred there perished or sought other homes. Since then the work of the government has been divided into educational and preventive channels.
