## MANY DEFECTS IN HEALTH CORRECTED

Nearly 2,000 or exactly 1,998 defects of Marion county school children have been corrected since last school year, according to a summary of results of rural teachers' inspections compiled yesterday by County School Superintendent Mary L. Fulkerson and submitted to the state school superintendent, C. A. Howard.

Pupils in 116 schools in the county were inspected by the teachers, with 7,904 of the 8,136 pupils enrolled being given a health inspection. Parents requested that 119 pupils be excused from the inspections.

Of the pupils examined, 3,001 had no defects, 1,194 were ten or more per cent underweight. Pupils having defective eyesight numbered 915 and those with hearing defects totaled 366, while mouth breathers chalked up to 852. Pupils with defective teeth were 3301 and the number unvaccinated was 2862.

Because of the unusually mild weather during the fall, only 20 schools were serving hot lunches to the children at the time the inspection reports were submitted to Mrs. Fulkerson.

Employment of foreign artists, the smaller casts of modern plays and the dissolution of provincial stock companies are blamed for the condition. The Minister of Labor, Louis Loucheur, told the chamber of deputies he would tighten the bars against foreigners.
