Last week we were discussing the National league records for the last season, trying to find out what they proved. We didn't get around to the pitchers.

"Complete games pitched" is a pretty fair criterion, because if a man pitches nine or more innings he's generally doing pretty fair work, the way baseball is played these days. As a rule, more balls are thrown in the bullnen than from the hilock, and there's a well worn one-way path from the one to the other.

Outside of a phenom named Lueas, who pitched for Cincinnati and worked 28 full games, Chicago's big three, Root, Malone and Bush, ranked among the highest, the first two completing 19 and the third 18. Hubbell of New York and Brame of Pittsburgh each pitched 19 full games, but they had no running mates in

Then we notice that in addition to pitching 18 full games, Bush finished 16 more. He took part in 50 games, more than any other pitcher in the league, and pitched 271 innings, allowing 177 hits. That was the lowest for any of the pitchers who pitched ten or more full games. But then Bush was a trifle

Mr. Malone led the league in shutouts, with five.

"Average runs earned per nine nning game" is probably the best criterion of pitching, and we find Root and Malone bunched together in third and fourth place on that basis, with Bush seventh. They were the only Cub pitchers working as many as ten full games. Down in the list of pitchers who didn't qualify on that basis we find Nehf. Cyengros. Horne and Carlson, all with .500 or better averages on games won, but rather high averages on earned runs. Offensive work saved
