Local Organization Puts on Monthly Session Here Monday Evening

Some of the fine points of the real estate law passed at the last session of the legislature and which went into effect recently were pointed out by C. V. Johnson, state real estate commissioner, before the monthly meeting of the Salem Realty Board held last night at the Marion.

Directors of a corporation may appraise property for their own corporation, but for no one else unless they have a broker's li-cense, he pointed as one of the big changes wrought by the law. The law places a new and strict interpretation on a real estate

broker and a salesman and it is at this point that his office is having to guard most closely, Johnson said.


