The clerk reported that for the quarter ending January 1, 1930, 285 members were enrolled in the church, 114 of which were men and 175 women, with 37 under the age of 16 years. Money raised in the quarter was \$2,350, according to books of the treasurer.

Of the \$1000 missionary apportionment for the year May 1, 1929, to May 1, 1930, \$646 has already been paid.

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
