War Mothers Plan Social Meeting

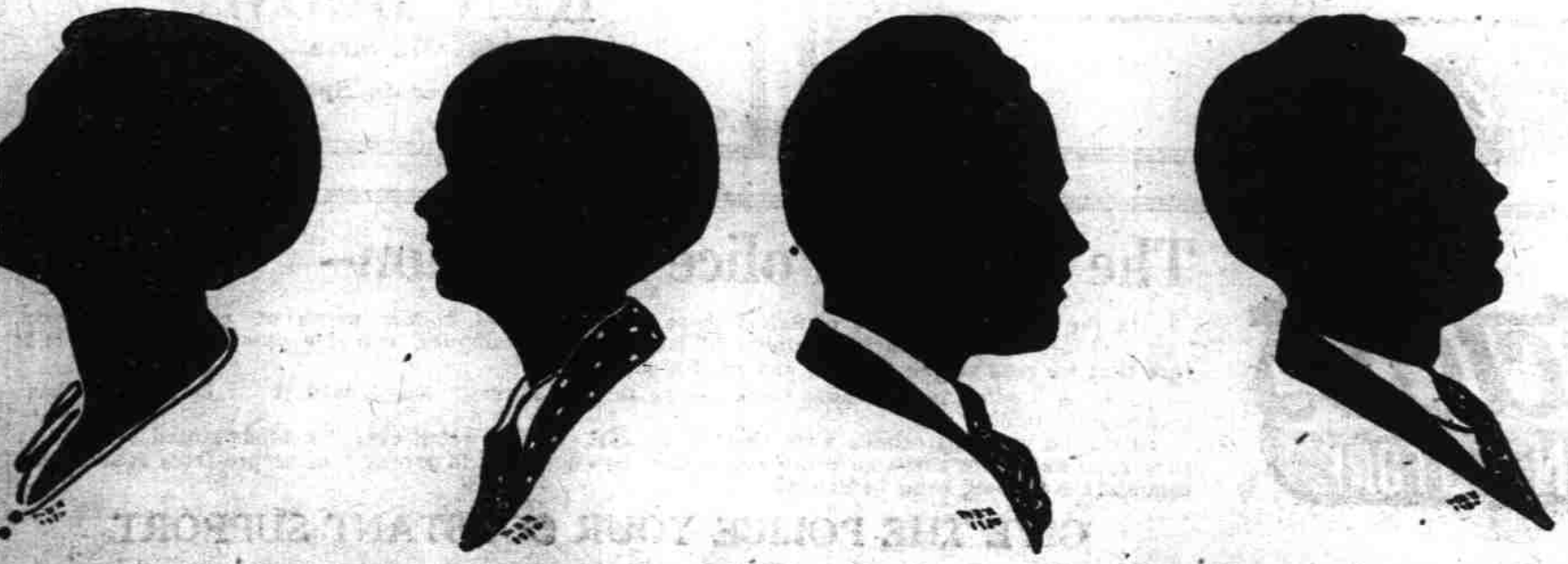
