STAYTON HOST TO CONVENTION

Annual Meeting of Sunday School Council to Be Held March 15-16

The thirty-first annual convention of the Marion county Sunday school council will convene at Stayton, Friday, March 14, and will continue through the following day. Sessions will be held in the Christian church.
