Now the good news is that we can do our canning in the modern way, using our oven. That was one of the things we always thought it to be done on top of the stove. Well, we can discard this obsolete method and be typically modern, and Elizabeth Reger will tell and show us how.

Now we can sit out on the lawn with a good book or perhaps some sewing, nice and cool in a crisp, pretty summer dress, or have an extra afternoon for golf or an automobile ride. And when we arrive home, our lovely cans and jars of fruit are waiting for us in a state of perfection.

No housewife can afford to miss an opportunity like this. Besides finding out more about canning, these experts will be glad to help you with any problem you may have in cooking or general kitchen routine.

PROPOSED JUDGE'S RECORD EXAMINED

WASHINGTON, March 26.—(AP)—With a delay in prospect on consideration of the nomination of Judge John J. Parker of North Carolina, to the supreme court, senators and other interested parties are scrutinizing his record.

While officials of the American federation of labor withheld a decision on whether to protect his confirmation, the newspaper "Labor" published by the railroad organizations, in its weekly issue today characterized the appointment as a "bitter disappointment to progressives."

Labor officials are studying the decision of Judge Parker as a member of the federal circuit court of appeals on an injunction case involving the United Mine workers.

Senator Borah, republican, Idaho, a member of the judiciary subcommittee considering the Parker nomination, has been asked by labor officials to examine this decision. He was not prepared to night to render his opinion on it.

Platform Given Out to Public

PORTLAND, Ore., March 26.—(AP)—Senator J. E. Bennett, candidate for the republican nomination for governor today issued his platform in which he championed independent merchants against chain stores, declared bank mergers a menace and favored the abolishment of the state public service commission. He says the enforcement of the 18th amendment can and will be better enforced if he is elected governor and that state ownership of power should be encouraged. He is opposed to issuing highway bonds, except for matching federal aid, until the present bond indebtedness has been retired.

CANADIAN RUM SYSTEM FAILS

Former Premier of Ontario Shows Wets' Favorite Argument Futile

facture of spirits was not prohibited at the time when the laws were most strict.

It was important to an understanding of the situation, he said, to realize that each province of Canada had different laws for the regulation of retail sale and that the dominion government limited its legislation to control of manufacturing and inter-province and foreign shipment.

Drury said he did not think the liquor question would continue as at present because of what he termed popular dissatisfaction and an increase of drinking in homes, hotel bedrooms and elsewhere and the enormous growth of the annual liquor bill which he said last year totaled \$192,000,000.

Women and Children Take Up Drinking

Liquor drinking, he added, was no longer a man's vice but women and children were exposed to it, due, he said, to the system of government control. The Canadian said that while the government liquor store system was supposed to control liquor, most Canadian provinces had "not really even a pretense at government control."

"It is government sale pure and simple," he added.

Drury expressed the hope that the next time the dominion government adopted prohibition it would abolish the manufacture of liquors as well as prohibit transportation and retail sale.

Drury said the bill before the Canadian parliament to prevent the legal exportation of liquor to the United States would be enacted. He said the measure was not only a favor to a friendly nation to aid it in enforcing its own laws but it would drive the Canadian borders of an undesirable criminal element.

Japan's Agreement to Three Power Treaty Delayed At Last Minute

The sudden re-emergence of the political aspects of disarmament has created a new sensation in the five power conference, and when, where or how the proposals for reconsideration of a council agreement were initiated remains a mystery.

Kaneko Givie British Credit For Move

The American delegation says the move came from the British and the British intimate that it came from the Americans but whatever its source, a new effort of far-reaching significance is being made to overcome the Franco-Italian deadlock. Whether it is likely to be successful rests with M. Briand, Premier Tardieu, and behind both of them, France.

The United States, Great Britain and Japan are making a supreme effort to produce a five-power treaty which will mean definite armament reductions as well as limitation of programs. The three powers, with a three-power treaty within their grasp, are making a last desperate attempt to extend the agreement to France and Italy.

UNION CHARTER OF MINERS IS REVOKED

INDIANAPOLIS, March 26.—(AP)—Revocation of the charter of district 14 of Kansas of the United Mine Workers of America and an amendment of provisional officers to replace the deposed board members and officers were added today to the expulsion yesterday of 20 union members on charges of disloyalty bringing to a close the activities of the 21st constitutional convention of the union.

John L. Lewis, international president, revoked the Kansas charter today by authority granted.
