COSGRAVE CABINET FORCED TO RESIGN

DUBLIN, Irish Free State, March 28.—(AP)—William T. Cosgrave, president of the executive council of the Irish Free State and head of the oldest ministry in post-war Europe, announced the resignation of his government today as a result of its defeat by two votes on an opposition pension bill in the Dail Eireann last night. The Dail then adjourned until next week.

The prevailing opinion in political circles was that he almost certainly would be re-elected president of the council when the Dail reassembles on Wednesday. Under the novel, and still experimental, ministerial system of the Free State, the way is open for his re-election. Resignation of a government does not necessitate the resignation of its members.

A weekend rest, Mr. Stimson retired to his country place at Stanmore, where Arthur Wilson Page, his personal aide, and Mrs. Page will be his guests.
Dino Grandi, of the Italian delegation and Reijiro Wakatsuki of the Japanese group also planned excursions from London but Mr. Briand fortified himself behind a barrier of books in his hotel and indicated that he did not wish to be disturbed.
Experts who are working on the various phases under consideration will continue over the week-end, with a view to definite progress before next Friday, when a plenary session will be held.
It was learned authoritatively and definitely today that the American delegation will make no move regarding the consultative pact before an agreement is reached on the political questions now being discussed between Great Britain and France; and secondly, until France is satisfied on the security issue and, being satisfied, has stated to what extent she will be prepared to reduce her naval tonnage to make a five-power disarmament agreement in London possible.

O'Kelly, leader of the Fianna in De Valera's absence, who called on Mr. Cosgrave to resign after the defeat yesterday, announced that the republicans would nominate De Valera for the presidency of the council.

The appearance of a third candidate tonight, in the person of T. J. O'Connell, parliamentary leader of the Irish Labor party, decidedly decreased Mr. De Valera's chances of being elected.

KELLOGG HOPEFUL
NEW YORK, March 28.—(AP)—Frank B. Kellogg, former secretary of state, expressed a hope tonight that the London naval conference would result in a reduction of armaments, not an increase toward parity.

JAMAICA GINGER FOUND SHEEP DIP
WASHINGTON, March 28.—(AP)—A drink of crude carbolic acid or creosote and alcohol flavored with ginger and sold by unscrupulous bootleggers as Jamaica ginger was said by Prohibition Commissioner Doran today to be the concoction that had caused hundreds of cases of paralysis in southern and southwestern states.

The commissioner made his announcement after prohibition bureau chemists had tested more than a hundred samples of "Jamaica ginger" collected in localities where cases of paralysis have been reported. He said that while it was hard to understand how any one of the ingredients in the mixture alone could have caused the paralysis, the combination had resulted in quick paralysis to those who had used it as a beverage.

Tests made by the bureau chemists, the commissioner said, showed that three-fourths to seven-eighths of the solid contents of the drink had been either creosote or carbolic acid and that the alcoholic content was as high as 80 or 90 per cent.

"Some scheming bootlegger who wanted to get rich quick devised the mixture and distributed it widely in the southern and southwestern states, where biting drinks have always been a favorite," Doran said. "We have traced the stuff to three focal points, two of which are in Cincinnati and St. Louis and we expect to follow the trail until we have the perpetrators under arrest."

The mixture is little better than "sheep dip" used to disinfect flocks of sheep.

Final Date For Immunizations Is Drawing Near
But two more Saturdays remain on which Marion county school children may have immunization treatments to fulfill requirements for the honor roll held each year throughout the schools. Last call for the honor roll ends April 10, on which date pupils must have had the first dose of toxin-antitoxin, according to word from the county health officer.

Toxin-antitoxin clinics are held from 8:30 to 10 o'clock each Saturday morning at the health center in Salem, and all school children who wish to qualify in this respect for the honor roll should report there either today or on April 5.

Administrative Policy in Regard to Haiti Announced By President

ine officers for all Haitian services be made for a minimum of four years. Further, it recommended that "an effort be made to secure Americans who will agree to continue employment in these services, so that upon the expiration of the treaty a force of American doctors, engineers, and police officers will be available for continued assistance to the Haitian government, should it then desire it."

Regarding the economic situation, the commission recommended the Haitian government be urged to appropriate for maintenance of existing roads before constructing new ones; and that only roads most urgently needed to develop settled regions under cultivation be undertaken until the present economic depression has passed.

Furthermore, the report urged that the American government interpose no objection to a moderate reduction of the customs duties, internal revenue taxes, especially those imposed upon alcohol and tobacco, or to a reduction or elimination of the export tax on coffee if the treasury condition warrants.

Employment by the Haitian government of one American adviser in each administrative department, with the American government maintaining them as an

act of grace, was also recommended. Immediate construction of a legation building at Port Au Prince was included in the recommendations.

As a sequent step, it was recommended that "in maintaining offices now in the Haitian service, or selecting new Americans for employment therein, the utmost care be taken that only those free from strong racial antipathies should be preferred."

AMBLING ALP GETS HIS 13TH KNOCKOUT
DENVER, March 28.—(AP)—Primo Carnera's 13th knockout victim, Jack McAuliffe of Detroit, fell before the giant Italian for two minutes and 18 seconds of fighting in a headline bout that was set for ten rounds here tonight.

A short right cross to the chin sent McAuliffe to the canvas for the count. He landed partly outside the ring and made but slight effort to return.

McAuliffe started to carry the fight to the Italian giant but his efforts were short lived. Carnera easily got in with his right uppercut and the 13th victim rolled over backwards. He took the count on nine before rising.
