BUTTER MART IS BECOMING WEAK

Supplies Accumulate to Exceed Demand Reports Say

PORTLAND, April 8-(AP)-Because of increasing supplies as compared with the demand, the butter market has developed a weak tone and a reduction in prices would not be surprising. Current quotations were declared to be out of line with the general situation. Butter in storage was said to have reached large propor-

tions. The egg market was steady with prices unchanged and with supplies plentiful. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bu-

reau of the United States department of agriculture says: "Cauliflower was firm with considerably lighter supplies and practically no competition from California. Roseburg's loadings are timited to about one carload daily, and the deal is expected to erminate soon, so far as carlot hipments are concerned. Sales to retailers ranged from \$1.50-1.75

Toward the close of March, prices for butter were within about seven cents of last year's levels, the most favorable price situation during the present year from the standpoint of producers. Preliminary reports, however, indicate that rather heavy storage holdings will again be earried forward this month, although production has tended to fall behind a year ago. Consumption of dairy products has not increased as

much as the January records gave reason to expect. In Pebruary, the apparent consumption of all dairy products combined was about 1.2 per cent less than in February, 1929, which about offset a decrease of 1.3 per cent in production. Butter production fell off about 1.7 per cent, but consumption scarcely equalled that of February, 1929. Cheese production gained 7 per cent, while consumption decreased 7 per cent. Production of evaporated and condensed milk decreased \$
