UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, April 12.—(AP)—The University of Oregon defeated Willamette university here today in a double-header baseball contest, 10 to 3 and 13 to 2. In each game the Bearcats led in the early innings only to have the Ducks overhaul and later pass them.

Although the pitchers on both teams did fairly well, the support of the Willamette moundmen was poor. In the seventh inning of the second game, Oregon scored six runs on only two hits. In the fifth inning of the same contest, an error paved the way for five runs, four of them after two were out.
