Exact Composition of Butter Substitutes Announced

Following a consideration of the situation arising from the sale of butter substitutes, the board of governors of the Oregon Feed Dealers association, newly-organized group of dealers in dairy and poultry feeds, meeting in Portland last week, adopted a strong resolution in favor of a more restrictive labelling law in Oregon for such products. The resolution, which was presented by Arthur Bushman, of Springfield Mill & Elevator Co., and unanimously adopted by the board was

as follows: "The Board of Governors of the Oregon Feed Dealers association Sep. hereby goes on record as favorable to legislation which shall provide that butter substitutes shall be required to be labelled with the name or names of the ingredients from which they are manufactured, which labelling shall be in type and appearance the same as the trade name of the

product itself." Referring to the resolution, Mr. Bushman, who is District Governor for the association for the Eugene district, said, "Knowledge of the content of oleomargarine should in our opinion lead to a lowering of its consumption, es- 28@30c; No. 2, 25c; culls, 20c; live, 18 pecially in the country districts, where it enjoys its largest sale, 8.50. and where its sale is most directly competitive with local production. There is a belief in many quarters that oleomargarine is largely a milk by-product, which is not true. We believe that spreading, through such labelling as suggested, of the knowledge of the nature and foreign derivation of butter substitutes, will be a distinct aid to the dairy industry, as well as a move toward better health through greater use of but-

ter." The resolution will be made a part of the instructions of the association's legislative committee, for consideration in connection with the next session of the Oregon state legislature.

Volume of **Shipments** Very Light

Depleted storage holdings of resh fruits and vegetables in the three states of the Pacific Northvest are indicated in carlot loadings for the week ending Friday, April 11, from these three states which total only 1383 ears. With only two or three exceptions (during stormy mid-winter weather), this is the lightest weekly volume of carlot shipments from this territory since last fall. Loadings of early spring vegetables from the northwest, although of considerable importance to localized areas were of small total volume compared with the volume of apples and potatoes moving from north-

Western storages. This week's loadings from Oregon include: apples 24 cars, caulfflower 6, onfons 38, pears 11, and potatoes 51 cars, totalling 130 carloads. Washington loaded: apples 536 cars, asparagus 19 cars, onions 5, pears 15, and potatoes 228 cars, totalling 803 carloads from that state. Idaho loaded: 26 cars of apples, 8 cars of onions, and 426 cars of potatoes, with a total of 450 cars from Ida-

Apple loadings from Idaho and

Oregon show only minor variation from recent weeks. Washington's volume declined 100 cars from that of recent weeks. The apple market strengthened at Yakima and Wenatchee shipping-points to the extent of 25 to 30c per box on nearly all varieties and classes Total U. S. loadings of apples was only 971 cars compared with the 1200 car average of recent weeks. Cauliflower movement from Roseburg, Oregon, totalled only 6 cars this week, bringing the spring cauliflower deal virtually to a close with a total of 63 cars to date. The cauliflower market strengthened slightly at north- as a 100 per cent club. To make western points, but the week closed with eastern demand very slow.
