VESPER HOUR'S SERVICE GIVEN

First Presbyterian Choir Will Present "Olivet to Calvary" on Easter

The choir of the First Presbyterian church will present Maunders' cantata "Olivet to Calvary" at 4:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon. The cantata tells of the scenes which marked the last few days of the Savior's life on earth. The rejoicing of the multitude, the view of Jerusalem from Olivet and the lament over the city, the scene in the Temple, and the lonely walk back over the Mount at night, form the chief features of the first part.

Part two opens with the Supper of the Passover, at which Jesus gives the new commandment of love for one another as the sign of true discipleship. The scene passes to the pathos of the Garden, the appearance of the hostile crowd, the loneliness of Jesus forsaken by his disciples, the tumult before Pilate, and the final tragedy and triumph of Calvary.
