

Il Duce Sees Daughter Become Bride at Church Wedding

EDDA MARRIES ITALIAN COUNT

Elaborate Ceremony Staged Amid Much Attendant Magnificence

ROME, April 24. — (AP) — Benito Mussolini, dictator of Italy since 1923, today, like a private citizen, saw his 19-year-old daughter, Edda, become the bride of Count Galeazzo Ciano, in a ceremony that despite all its attendant magnificence was really but a wedding in a private family.

In Il Duce's parish church, St. Joseph's on the Via Nomentana, the daughter of the dictator and the son of the Italian minister of communications were married by the parish priest, Monsignor Pasquelli.

Their wedding, except for the picturesqueness of fascist "black shirts" with glittering bayonets, was simple, in accordance with Il Duce's preference for keeping his family life in the background. Had he asked for it, the premier could have obtained for the wedding any basilica in Rome or even St. Peter's itself with a cardinal instead of a parish priest officiating.

Pope Pius XI sent the bride couple a solid gold rosary and his blessing. King Victor Emmanuel, signing himself "your most affectionate cousin," sent congratulations to the premier from the royal family. King Zog I of Albania wished the newlyweds good fortune and prosperity.

The wedding breakfast at the Villa Torlonia, the duce's residence, was a simple family gathering, attended by the parish priest and four witnesses.

"FIVE HOURS TO LIVE"



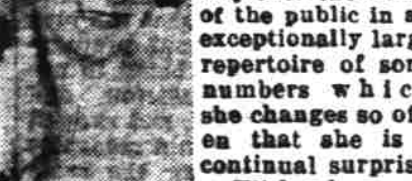

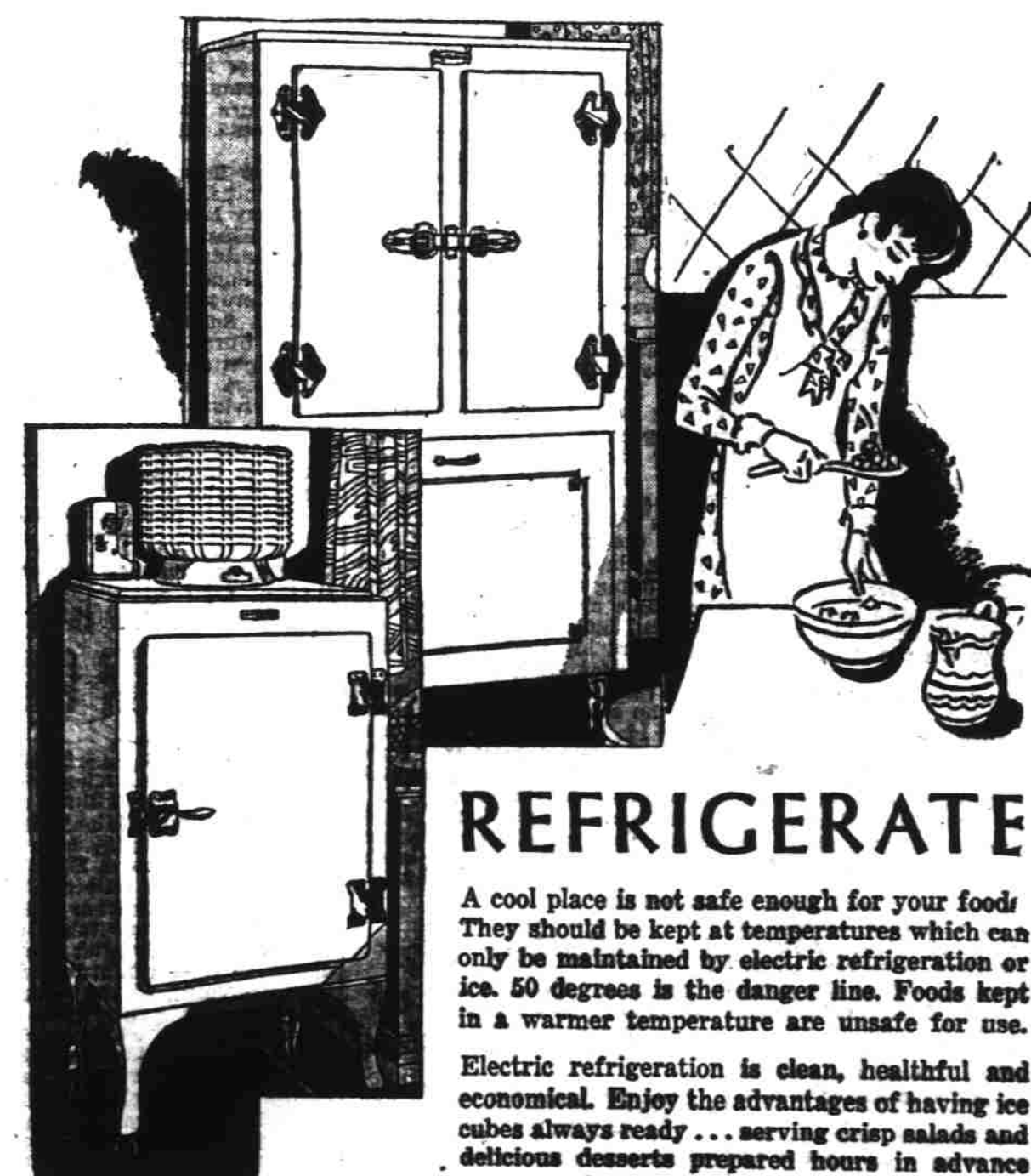
