## Business Woman Advocates Revised Ideals FINE PLAY IS PRODUCED

When Dr. Olga Stastny of Omaha, Nebraska, official physician of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs said "Business Women should learn to loaf like men, with their feet on the desk. If they wish to do bigger and better things," she probably never intended to inspire authors and musicians with a sense of creativeness but that is what she accomplished.

Her declaration was published all over the country through the Associated Press and members of the Medford Business and Professional Women's club saw the possibilities of such an idea and set to work to write a one act play around Dr. Stastny's council.

The theme song entitled "Put Your Feet on the Desk" has been widely praised and Salem club members who will be in Medford are eagerly awaiting the production which will be staged in the auditorium of the Medford Junior high school on Saturday evening, May 17.

Dr. Stastny was especially invited to attend the premier of the play but will be unable to be present. Miss Marion McClench, national president of the federation will however attend the Medford convention.

# Freak Tree Found Near Selah Area

CENTRAL HOWELL, May 1.—There is a tree on Reuben Eggin's place near Selah Springs which is an odd freak of nature.

At the base of this tree is an outcropping of roots which forms a sort of edge 20 feet in circumference and about two feet high. Out of the middle of this clump grows a maple tree or what looks like four main trunks extending up from these roots. At a height of 10 feet a fir tree emerges from the trunks of the maple and stands straight and tall, possibly 60 feet, while the four main trunks spread out a little surrounding the lower part of the fir.

# SCHOOLS WILL NOT UNITE WITH CANBY

AURORA, May 1.—The Barlow school district held a meeting at the school house Tuesday evening April 29 at 8 o'clock for the purpose of casting a ballot to determine if the Barlow grade school would consolidate with the Canby grade school. There were 118 votes cast, 75 in favor of retaining the school at Barlow and 43 to unite with Canby.

Another meeting for the same purpose was held in school district 91. The result of the ballot was 133 votes cast, 91 to remain as is and 42 to unite with Canby.

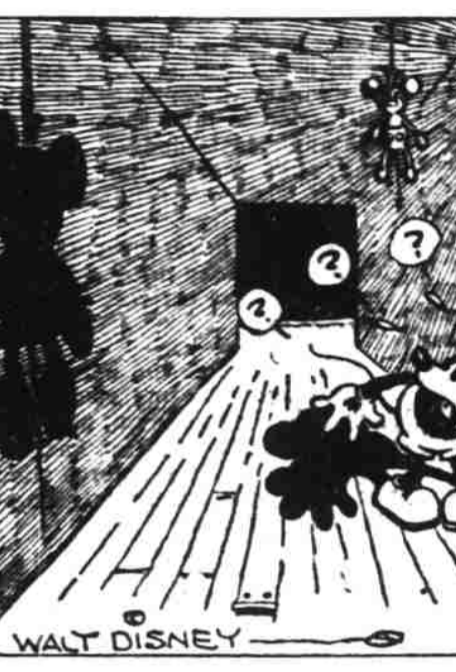
