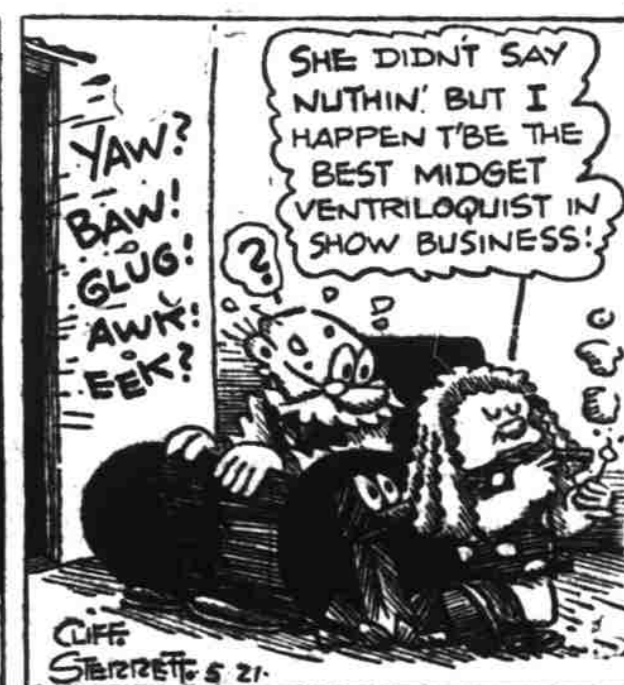
YOUNG LADY PLANS AIRPLANE JOURNEY

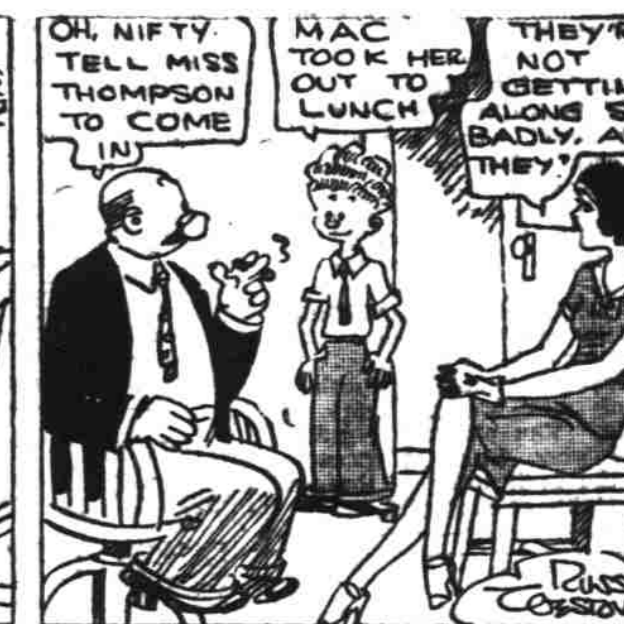
